

## **DR. PATTI HILL INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT**

Dr. Patti Hill from Edmonton, Alberta, Canada was elected to serve as international president of Lions Clubs International at the association's 105th International Convention, July 7 through July 11, 2023.

International President Hill is president of a consulting firm. With 30 years of experience as an educator and psychologist, she has mentored graduate students and psychologists in training. She has also championed the rights of children and youth who are deaf and/or blind.

A member of the Edmonton Host Lions Club since 1990, International President Hill has held many offices within the association, including district chairperson for Membership, Environment, Convention and International Cooperation and Understanding. Additionally, she has served as a committee member for the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum, multinational coordinator for Campaign SightFirst II, secretary for the Lions Eyebank (Alberta) Society, Vice President of the Lions Eye Research Institute of Northern Alberta and presenter at many forums and conventions. Dr Hill is a founding member of the Lions of Canada Consultative Committee.

In recognition of her service to the association, International President Hill has received numerous awards, including several International President's Awards. She has been honored with the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. She is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, and recipient of numerous other fellowships.

In addition to her Lions activities, International President Hill is active in numerous professional, human rights, and community organizations. In the past, she served as an executive officer of the Alberta Association of School Psychologists and the Association of Canadian Educators of the Hearing Impaired. International President Hill has also served on the Alberta Premier's Council on Persons with Disabilities.

## PATRICK JULIAN

26 November 1929 – 28 June 2023

There is a poem called "The Dash" and it says that what mattered most of all was the dash between those years. Pat was busy right through his life. After leaving school he worked as a projectionist in North Taranaki for two yrs, then became an electrician. He did 2 ½ terms as Borough Councillor, 18 mths on newly formed Taranaki Hospital

Board, 38 yrs as Chairman of Forrestral House Committee, Chairman of Inglewood Mainstreets Redevelopment Committee and set up Inglewood First. He was also involved with search and rescue missions and became very good at fundraising. He was in Jaycees for 10 yrs.

Then in 1967 Lions arrived in Inglewood and Pat was Charter President for 15 months, followed by year as Secretary, 3 yrs on Cabinet, followed by nearly 7 yrs as Chairman of the Inglewood Lions Club International Relations Committee which organized tours to Australia, Sth Africa, Hawaii, Canada and Japan. Pat and Jean also attended numerous conventions both in N.Z and overseas. He became President again in 2016-2017 when our club celebrated 50 yrs of service and also that same year Inglewood Lions Club hosted the District 202D Convention.

Pat was awarded a Melvin Jones Fellowship in 2017. He was also made a Life member of Inglewood Club as well as life member of the Lloyd Morgan Lions Clubs Charitable Trust. Pat was an "ideas" man. In 1984 Southland had terrible floods. Pat took a proposal along to Lions. They raised \$14,000 and bought 100 kids and family support to Taranaki for a break. In 2010 after Christchurch earthquakes Pat came up with an idea again. In 2013 after they had raised approx. \$18,000 a Lions Free Family Fun Day at Ferrymead in Christchurch was held. Nearly 8,300 people through the gate for this free day. Pat was the driving force behind the idea for the Inglewood Community Mini Golf which opened after many years of planning in 2021. It has been an outstanding success, bringing a lot of people into Inglewood and providing funds to many organisations. Pat along with Inglewood Lions member Gordon spent many hours resurrecting wooden toys that Dean Underwood had donated to Inglewood Lions Club that had many pieces missing. They turned those broken toys into ones that were now complete and were able to be sold raising a few thousand dollars which went to a International Measles Fundraiser as well as local charities.

The amount of hours that Pat has tirelessly put into Lions Projects, events and fundraising over the last 56 years is massive. It shows the true dedication that Pat had for Lions. Pat would not have been able to contribute as much to Lions as he did without the support of Jean and his family, so we thank them for that as Pat has been a very valuable member of Lions, his knowledge and experience will be greatly missed.

Rest in Peace Lion Pat your service to Lions is now complete.

All you must do is supply applicants with a Service Tracking record form. These are available from your Youth Chairman so that progress can be monitored.

The forms must be collected before the closing date of **November 30th** of each year and returned to your District Youth Chairman. The certificate will arrive directly to your club. You will need to organise a time to present the certificate to your applicant, perhaps at a club meeting would be suitable.

The District Youth Chairperson would like to attend a presentation where possible.

This can be a steppingstone to further youth activities both within your club and for the youth involved.

The Maryann Home and Hospital is owned by the community of Central Taranaki. They decided to build a new wing onto the hospital and dedicate 18 of the rooms for hospital and dementia patients, so that they can stay in the community and be near their families.

The cost to furnish each room was \$12000 which included the purchase of specialized equipment - tilting beds, lazy boys, and lifts etc.

It was decided to host an evening in Stratford called 'From Grassroots to the World Stage'. Local sporting personalities were invited to speak. Robyn Barrett spoke about her wonderful sporting family. Colin Cooper, ex-rugby player and Coach of the Hurricanes, Chiefs and the Maori All Blacks shared his story. Mike Sandle also spoke of his experiences managing the New Zealand Cricket Team. He is now the CEO of Taranaki Rugby. They were all outstanding speakers, and the crowd thoroughly enjoyed listening to their experiences.

Just over 200 people attended and with an auction on the night \$17900 was raised. We were very grateful for the sponsored and donated items from local people and businesses that were sold at auction. Thanks to Peter McDonald for doing the auctioneering. We received a grant for \$12000 from the Lloyd Morgan Trust and the Stratford Lions donated \$6000 towards the final figure. In total, three rooms have been furnished.

The catering was all donated from the clubs and their members and served by local School Students. We would like thank everyone for their support of this incredibly successful event. A local person who was attending the function approached a Toko lions member and said it was such a great cause he would pay for a room . It was a wonderful experience for the four clubs and certainly shows what clubs working together can achieve. .




# Opunake Lions Club have Rowan speak about his charity ride from Cape Reinga to Bluff:

# The Glob Report

## July 2023

Dr Warren and I have just returned from visiting Lions District 202J. and the annual NZ Young Farmers Club Competition in Winchester, near Timaru. This was where the history of the 52 year competition was rewritten with the first woman Young Farmer from Pirongia in the Waikato taking out the national title against six others. Well done Emma Poole.

We didn't take the Glob but took our Lions flags, signage, medical consumables, - test equipment, questionnaires etc. so we could run and demonstrate to the local Lions how the project functions.

I was privileged to sneak away from our South Island Lions My Health Check for 15 minutes to cheer on Jade Askin & William Russell the two students from Feilding High School as they built a garden planter from 75x50 timber with a handsaw and a screwdriver, planted 6 native scrubs, wired an electric fence to waratahs plus completed a Ravensdown fertilizer challenge and other farming operations.

For the Friday NZ YFC event at Winchester, we had a loan caravan arranged by 202j District Governor Jules Ellis, a front of house team of Lion Michele from Fairlie, two nurses, Jenny from Pleasant Point and Penny from Timaru, plus our Dr Warren. 58 people were checked and 11 referred to their GP for follow up so an increase of Dr Warren's toll bill this time. A good number came from the North Island areas of Kaeo, Waikato, Dannevirke, Wairarapa and the rest from the Mainland. A frosty start of -6 degrees and 20mm of frozen ground that finally thawed in the sunny areas at 10.30a.m.

On the Saturday we met in the Timaru Tongan Church hall, (a lot warmer) and processed 24 people with 12 being referred to their GP. Usual BP and Blood sugar excess reading plus suicidal thoughts and a low vision detected.

Our generous host the IPDG Jules Ellis after the Timaru site visit had arranged for us to meet with and present a powerpoint plus covering discussion on the Glob and Lions My Health Check project with Lions Presidents from Temuka and Geraldine.




