# The Treasurer Talks

ny clubs which are not internet banking already are urged to arrange to do so as soon as they can. It will be far easier to become accustomed to this system when there is no immediate pressure to do so rather than leaving it until the only option is no option.

Here are some important points:

- ANZ Bank has set change dates as follows: no new cheque books after 30 November and no cheque processing after 31 May 2020
- District will be unable to accept cheques after 30 April 2021 because of possible processing delays any cheques received after that date will be returned to the sender
- It is not your bank alone which is the important test; one more major bank setting a different date could
  put the whole system out of gear
- · Every bank has good training facilities, and they are all dedicated to helping
- Every club has members who are experienced with internet banking

   use their help also
- It does not have to be the club treasurer who carries out this function so long as the usual control features are in place, such as multiple authorizations and board sanctioned receipts and payments.

The next club payments to District will be the half-yearly dues accounts billed as at the end of December. It would not be unreasonable to expect that almost all of these will be made by internet banking.

The world is facing many challenges, natural disasters, Famine and disease. While the problems may seem insurmountable when faced alone, we can all take comfort through the strength of our nearly 1.5 million Lions, and our ability to provide immediate needs when this is required.

LCIF Campaign 100 – Lions empowering service. The goal from LCIF of raising \$300 million has now been extended to June 2022 because of COVID-19. Lions World Sight Day is commemorated every year on the second Thursday of October. It was first initiated by the Lions Clubs International Foundation under the Sight First Campaign in the year 2000. This day is celebrated to create awareness about vision impairment, blindness and other sight related problems. This is something that you might like to note and plan for a special day in your calendar for next year. A date to remember is November 14<sup>th</sup> which is World Diabetes Day, check out "Lions fight diabetes" on the International Lions website and view the information posted there.

Please continue to support LCIF and the work they are doing throughout the world in these challenging times especially with the deadly coronavirus.

**Footnote:** Yes, we have recently had a disaster in our area with the fires in the Lake Ohau area. As indicated in communications from DG Ella, we had discussions with the Civil Defense Coordinator for the area Lion Murray Linwood and others, who advised that at the time of the fires an Emergency Grant from LCIF was not needed. Once things have settled a little it may be that we could be eligible for alternative LCIF funding pending the needs.

#### Part 2: The Operation of the Trust

he Trust has its own Constitution and Rules that were approved by Multiple District Council and endorsed at subsequent Multiple District Conventions.

Administration of the Trust is the responsibility of the Trust Board who are responsible to the Multiple District Council.

#### The Trust consists of the following:

- Chairman elected by the Board and appointed by Multiple District Council.
- District Trustees (7) elected by their respective Districts.
- Advisory Trustees (no more than 5) recommended by the Board and appointed by Multiple District Council.
- > Multiple District Council Chairman.
- International Director (current or immediate past).
- Trust Officers. The board appoints non-voting officers to oversee the operation of the Trust. These being:
  - a. Treasurer
  - b. Legal Counsel
  - c. Administration Officer

The Trust operates within the parameters of the Trust Policy Code.

#### The principle is quite simple:

- Donations to the Trust are deposited in the Capital Fund, which is invested to provide an income for the Trust.
- Donations to the Capital Fund are recorded under the Club's name and will remain untouched for the life of the Trust.

- Income generated from investments goes into the Income Fund, and it is this money that is available to the Trustees to disburse to Clubs according to set guidelines.
- Clubs can apply to the Trust for a grant or loan, to assist them with completion of projects that qualify as being of a charitable nature.
- Every application is treated on its merits, clubs must have adopted the project, be committed to its completion, and be directing enough of their resources, (cash, labour) towards the project to provide a major proportion of the necessary funds.
- The Trust does not make grants so that clubs can simply pass them on as donations and is not there to substitute for a club's own fundraising effort.
- Contact your District Trustee if you require any further information on making a grant application.

**Club Donations:** Each Lions year clubs are asked to renew their support of their Trust by making a donation of \$10 per member. Clubs that donate to their Trust receive a banner patch after their first donation, then year tabs for subsequent years if they wish to.

**Trust Recognition Awards:** These are available to recognise individuals, (Lion or non-Lion), and other organisations or companies in a uniquely New Zealand fashion.
