



# Gore Host

### ST JAMES THEATRE (Wow what a project)

After a long history as an important local entertainment venue the St James Theatre was on the verge of being closed. This was regarded by many as a vital amenity to the area and rather than seeing it lost for all time, a trust was formed (including a representative from the Gore Lions Club) to purchase, refurbish and manage it in association with the Gore Operatic Society.

The Society undertook to lease the premises in 1987 and put up \$50,000 of its own money to help the trust purchase the building.

The trust board and members of the Gore Lions Club made the commitment of \$50,000 over a five year period to help support the trust, and the Operatic Society.

In 1988 Gore Lions Club members, along with the Gore Operatic Society, worked extremely hard to refurbish the backstage area and the entire proceeds of the 1989 Festival Week were given over to the Trust.

In 1991 a further \$10,000 of Gore Lions Club funding was given over to completing the landing into the back stage, completing the new boiler house and paying the architect.

The next mission for Lions members were to upgrade the frontage of the theatre, move the stage forward, install a proscenium arch and a backstage wall and assist in re-raking the auditorium seating.

Chair of the St James Theatre Trust and a tireless worker for the theatre project was Lion Mervyn Hellier. He worked solidly though-out the five critical years of refurbishment and led the many weekend and evening working bees required to bring the project to fruition.

Our local lions club + the Lloyd Morgan Trust have donated \$103000 to the St James theatre Trust for the upgrade.

Gore Host club has supported the St James Theatre Trust since

1988.




