We have been awaiting the result of an application for the remaining amount of funding needed for this project, \$120,000.00 but unfortunately have just heard that we were unsuccessful.

However we have discovered another possible funding option, which we hope will be successful. This application process for this opens in January, 2021.

We are continuing to look at other options to fundraise also. At this stage, we still plan to order the lift and do the off-site work through the last six months of 2021.

With everything going to plan, the installation of lift and onsite structural work will be done starting at the end of January, 2022, a year later than planned due to circumstances.

Gore and Districts St James Theatre Trust is very grateful for the generous donation of \$103,000.00 given by local Lions Clubs and Lloyd Morgan Trust towards this worthy project for the Gore public.


