Our speaker at our last dinner was Frank Vinac, a local of Dalmatian descent.

Frank gave a brief history of the Dalmation Coast and a summary of what immigrants had encountered and endured in coming to New Zealand.

Anyone who has been to the Dalmation Coast (now mainly part of Croatia) will have seen a very barren land – Frank advised us that the lack of trees was due to the Venetians taking these for their buildings' foundations.

Most of the immigrants were young men chosen by the Church to travel, and hopefully be able to send money back to 'the old country' which was particularly hard hit by the ongoing recession of the 1800s, and the impact of Turkish occupation of the hinterland (one reason that Frank's ancestors were restricted to the poor and infertile coast). Many stayed in NZ, of course, marrying locally and making a home here.

Their effects are well-known in the Far North, with many family names surviving and thriving - Vinac, Subritzky, Jurlina, Shroj, to name a few.

In an aside **Lion Alan Moros** told us of his own grandfather who had been one of 11 Dalmation immigrants to survive the sinking of the Elingamite at the Three Kings Islands on 9<sup>th</sup> November 1902 carrying a large consignment of gold. (Lion Alan didn't say whether granddad had picked up any of the gold!). **Secretary John** thanked Frank for his illuminating talk.
