I also appreciate a good joke. So if you hear a good one, pass it on.



FUND RAISING CHALLENGE

In Aid of Alex Baker's Treatment for Stage 3 Melanoma Cancer

Alex is a 24 year old single mother of two young children living in Feilding and a close relative of a long serving member of the Lions Club of Kairanga.

Diagnosed with Stage3 Melanoma Cancer in May, Alex has begun the KEYTRUDA immunotherapy treatment that will give her the best chance of fighting this aggressive cancer.

Each treatment cost \$8500 and is administered every three weeks for up to 12 months.

KEYTRUDA is funded in New Zealand but Alex does not fall within the funding criteria.

The Lions Club of Kairanga has resolved to raise Fifty thousand dollars toward the cost of the Keytruda treatment for Alex. 100% of the funds raised will be used to pay for the treatment.

The club has already underwritten the first 11 thousand dollars from its reserves and is seeking support from businesses and individuals in our community and asking those supporters to challenge other businesses and individuals to match or better their contribution.


All contributions will be paid into the Lions Club of Kairanga charity account specifically set aside for this project with all donations eligible for a tax deductible donation receipt.






Emerging Lions Leadership Institute

A brief summary of the Mini Golf project

PN Middle District

- Instigated I June 2017
- Presented to PNCC Hearing on Esplanade Masterplan June 2018
- Approval from PNCC that Mini Golf Course included in Esplanade Master Plan
- PN Middle District approved funding for resource consent application prepared by Perception Planning Consultants June 2020
- A lot of consultation with council officers and their consultants in the period from June 2018 until Resource Consent application forwar ded to PNCC in December 2020.
- Numerous design options prepared over that period to get to the stage all parties were happy with the option submitted
- Resource consent granted end of March 2021
- PN Middle Districts approval to proceed with investigations and project risks/costings
- Investigation work on risks and costings progressing such as Lease document with PNCC
 On site existing services being located before ground testing commences Costings and funding options

This project was seen as an opportunity for Middle District Lions Club to enhance the activities available in the Esplanade for families and wider community. It also was seen as a long-term benefit to our Lions Club by;

- Enhancing club profile in the community
- Potentially replacing the car avan
- Providing a more sedentary role for club members
- Enabling the club to be positively involved in the community
- Providing the club with significantly more funds for community betterment
- Potentially reinvigorating the club and membership satisfaction.

Potentially increasing membership

Progress will continue in all area's and it was heartening that the Club continues to give this project unanimous support and involvement.

There have been significant contributions by DWD Drafting, Perception planning and PNCC. Thankyou to Craig, John and Richard.


