

Scary really that there are surgeons like this among us – I am sure there will be more than we haven't uncovered yet but this series is loosely based on the true story about Dr Christopher Duntsch.

Christopher Duntsch is now serving a life sentence in a Texas prison for multiple counts of aggravated assault relating to botched Dallas surgeries - including two that resulted in the patient's death. Described as a substance-abusing malignant narcissistic, Duntsch reportedly injured 33 patients in two years.

Duntsch had ambitions to be a football star, but when he realized that wasn't going to happen, he became interested in medicine. He earned a Ph.D. and M.D. in neurosurgery from the University of Tennessee, Memphis, where he completed a five-year residency for neurosurgery and one year of training for general surgery, before moving to Dallas in 2005.

Several Memphians and former Memphians were close to Duntsch, including Wendy Renee Young, the mother of his two sons, and childhood friend Jerry Summers, a lifelong Memphian and high-school "consummate athlete" (according to his obituary) who remained loyal even after he emerged paralyzed from cervical fusion surgery performed by Duntsch in Texas in 2011. Summers, aged 50, died in Memphis, after battling infections and other complications of the botched surgery for the past decade.

My verdict: Worth watching even if it is a bit creepy!

Lions spokesperson Olwyn Hill says the Club did something similar for the Women's Centre during a previous winter. "It's one of those feel-good things. It made us feel warm to know that we were helping kids keep warm," she says.


A wife was making a breakfast of fried eggs for her husband. Suddenly, her husband burst into the kitchen.
