ions Clubs International is an association of clubs. That is why it is 'We Serve' not 'I Serve.'

International President Douglas X Alexander says that our diversity is our greatest strength not our weakness. The key role of Cabinet is to support the clubs in their District. One way we do this is by talking to Lions everywhere about what they are doing in their clubs and share what is happening.

The Rakaia Club has thought about their membership. In order to increase it they are going to develop a 'friends list.' The 'friends list' consists people in the community who support the club. Support can be different things - they may help on working bees, give prizes for functions, give sponsorship or speak at their tea meetings. The 'friends' are then kept informed of what is happening in the club, are invited to working bees and to tea meetings. All this will set the seed for some 'friends' becoming members - congratulations President Mark

Cressey and members for a good idea worth sharing.

The Rakaia Club also published some interesting information they have about who visits their Facebook page. 83% of the visitors were women. Of those 83%, most were women aged 35-44 and next it was women aged 25-34. Those statistics raise some important points about who Lions think are the potential new members to carry our service into the second century of Lions. On a similar note, the Waitaki District has people from more than 50 different nationalities registered as living there. The question these points raise for us, is do our clubs reflect our communities, do our clubs draw their strength from the diversity of our communities which, International President Alexander says, is our greatest strength?

The Treasurer Talks

he following is a quote from District 202J's expenses claim protocol booklet:

"Meal costs incurred when the DG, or if delegated by the DG, 1st VDG, or 2nd VDG, Zone Chairmen, or separately, appointed Cabinet officers visit clubs, are to be at the expense of the club concerned and this also applies to any accompanying person. Clubs will be reminded at the start of each Lions year of this obligation by the District Treasurer."

This provision does not apply to any Cabinet officers who are visiting a club of which they are a member, or any occasion where they visit other clubs on a

casual basis, or for their own pleasure and do not expect to contribute significantly to the meeting and nor has it been planned that they do so.

Please circulate these requirements throughout your club as it is somewhat embarrassing for these visiting people to have to explain to cashiers on the spot what the position is, only to find that even such an explanation is sometimes challenged.



Hi All,

First let me introduce myself. I am Ken Whitcombe, a member and Past President and the current Secretary and Membership Chairman of Green Island Lions.

In Zoom meetings with other GMT Co-ordinators in Multiple District 202 we have recognised that retaining and attracting members requires action at the club level because the members of the local club know their local community best and are the face of Lions in that community. As GMT Co-ordinators we will only succeed by working with clubs in their own communities. This is why I have been working with Zone Chairmen to assess interest in and to arrange membership consultation and seminar sessions in each Zone.

These sessions will be open to any Lions, not just club officers. I look forward to meeting as many of you as possible at these sessions. I want to hear what opportunities you see and plans you have for growing your club and discuss how I and others in the District can assist with ideas, access to resources and sharing experiences of other clubs.

The dates and venues of these sessions will be advised to Zone Chairmen and club secretaries and Membership Chairmen well in advance.

Learnings from Multiple District emphasise:





◆ The money raised goes towards funding cochlear ear implants (government funding has been reduced).





Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is a Dr. Franklin G. Mason Fellow, a W. P. Woods Fellow and a progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lions activities. President Alexander is active in numerous professional and community organizations. He has served as chairperson of the advisory board for the New York Urban League and as a board member of the St. Francis DeSales School for the Deaf. He is also a recipient of the Congressional Record Award.

President Alexander has two daughters, and his partner in service, Shabiki Cazabon, is a Lion and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

COVID-19 appeal and Haiti Earthquakes

CIF has made an appeal to all Lions clubs and individual Lions for donations to LCIF's Disaster Relief Fund. This is to support COVID-19 and ongoing pandemic relief efforts within those countries and regions such as India, Sri Lanka, and in our Constitutional Area VII, in Indonesia. These countries are experiencing a resurgence of cases and increasing death rates.

LCIF recognises that health care systems in these countries are overwhelmed due to limited resources needed to provide life saving medical treatment. Such resources include medical equipment and supplies for hospitals, medical clinics and other government recognised medical facilities that serve as satellite locations for treatment and care.

Lions International President Douglas Alexandra recently stated that "your Lions service makes a difference in your communities every day, but more importantly clubs generous giving to LCIF enables Lions around the world in the time of humanitarian need, to provide incredible service that's only possible through your support to LCIF."

As with all COVID-19 grant allocations, they are closely coordinated with the local Lions Multiple District and Medical Sector involved. They will jointly be responsible for procuring the medical equipment and other necessary supplies, and the distribution of these. All COVID grants must be utilized within 60 days of issue.

Haiti, one of the poorest countries in the world, was struck by two devastating earthquakes followed by Cyclone Eta in mid-August.

The first earthquake of 7.2 magnitude and the following day a 5.8 magnitude quake, caused major destruction with many towns destroyed, schools, churches and hospitals damaged and over 2,200 deaths (at the time of writing), leaving thousands injured and homeless. Haiti with its 11 million population of which 59% live in poverty is still recovering from the 2010 earthquake which resulted in 200 thousand people dying, extensive damage to infrastructure and the country's economy.

To quote IP Alexander: "in this instance where kindness matters most, please serve and give from the heart to those in their hour of need". Your club's generosity in supporting LCIF disaster relief fund has never been more needed. FYI – as always, when donating to LCIF, note what the deposit is for ie COVID-19 relief in Indonesia, or Haiti earthquake etc as the case may be. All donations are eligible for Melvin Jones Fellowship credits and Campaign 100 recognition.

♣ Port Chalmers & District:


