
Lions at the Lodge Leadership Weekend

The detailed programme will be sent to all participants; however, it is intended that we have interaction between participants and share ideas and thoughts.

Dinner and breakfast to be catered for by our volunteer team from food supplied by the organisers, Dietary requirements will be noted when Lions register, We are asking that each participant brings a plate for morning / afternoon teas to assist the team in the kitchen. Camp Quality Waikato/ Bay of Plenty

Sadly our Winter Camp at Ngamuwahine (in the Kaimas) had to be cancelled due to going into lockdown. We now have enough frozen Cottage Pies in the freezer to feed 80 people.

Due to Covid we have had to postpone Training weekend (all our volunteers must attend a training to be able to attend our summer camp in January). But hopefully we will be able to hold training at the beginning of November and eat the pies. This is not ideal as we will have to match our campers and companions at the same time. At this stage we are not sure if it will be a weekend or just a day training.

A weekend training gives everyone time to team build and get to know one another. A day training is a bit rushed and then we have to do the matching after wards. All volunteers also have to be Police checked.

I visited the Cambridge Lions reuse shed as they are going to supply the cooking equipment etc we need to enable us to self cater for summer camp. The venue for Summer camp has very little catering equipment on hand and Cambridge Lions offered to help us.

Summer Camp is at Awakeri (Whakatane area) in the Events Centre. It has a large hall with a commercial kitchen, bathroom facilties, and dinning area to seat 130. We will erect 20 tents to accommodate everyone (I am taking the Motorhome) on the playing field in front of the events centre but the primary school which is next door allows us to use some of the classrooms for actitives and perhaps sleep some of the younger children. The school also give us full use of the swimming pool.

Summer Camp is from 8th to 14th January 2022.



Looking Back 30 Years:

In 1991 One officer embarked on a campaign to improve road safety in New Zealand.

Funding to begin the project was provided by The Lions Club of Remuera to the staggering amount of \$250,000 (remember, this was 30 years ago); The ASB tossed in another \$100,000 and Lions throughout the rest of New Zealand added a further \$150,000.

The truck and trailer (pictured below) was purchased and refurbished including displaying the Lions logo.

The 'Lions for Life' was the biggest road safety campaign undertaken in New Zealand at that time, it visited over 2500 schools – teachers at the schools were able to choose resources that they believed would benefit their pupils and Remuera Lions Club would pay the first \$100 of the school's order and local clubs would pay the balance giving schools invaluable resources free of charge.

During the 10 months that the Lions for Life Roadshow travelled NZ the driver (and often some support crew) was billeted by local Lions.


