Unfortunately I missed the deadline for the November edition when I reported that that ongoing issues with Covid19 has meant that the summer camp scheduled for next January has been cancelled, much to the disappointment of Zone 10 and other Lions helpers.

Of course the greatest losers will be the children. Summer Camp is an event that is looked forward to each year with great anticipation. But, as you would expect, the Camp Quality team is acutely aware of this and it has come up with an ingenious plan to mitigate against some of the disappointment the children (and their parents) will be experiencing.

#### Camp in a Box

Every child will be sent a box of goodies that will contain items that they would use on a "normal" camp. These will include a book, toy/game/puzzle, an activity booklet with contents all connected with things associated with Camp, amongst other things. Boxes will be individualized to include material particularly relevant to the child receiving it. Camp organisers are aware of individual interests.

The Camp Quality committee for this area is reasonably confident that they have enough manpower to pack the fifty boxes needed but Lions could be asked if they could help with delivery in early January. Watch this space. The monetary value of each box will be approximately \$250. So far clubs in 202L have donated \$8000 to CQ in this Lions year. This means that there is a shortfall of \$4500 for the \$12500 needed. District Governor Suez has taken on board the project totally and intends to raise that total required by all means possible. The Camp Quality authorities have been very happy to give Lions the "naming rights".

#### **Virtual Summer Camp Activities**

Believe it or not "on line" activities are also in the pipe line. Suggestions have been a bus sing-along, virtual art/baking experiences (material available in the boxes). Other ideas in the planning are a photo scavenger hunt and a quiz night (using zoom I presume). The imaginative skills of the young and largely female committee are breathtaking.

Not quite the real thing but the children will certainly know that they have not been forgotten.

Here is the Calendar for the coming 2 months as to what is going on with our Global Causes and other projects that we can support.



Waihi Lions Club has recently received 2700 copies of its biennial Community Directory. The Community Directory, which is published biennially, has been a major contributor to the clubs Charitable Trust for the last forty years.

In the past the club has purchased telephone listings from, firstly Telecom and latterly, Yellow. These are no longer available so the club has had to compile its own, firstly by phoning every single number in the previous edition to eliminate addresses which no longer have a land line, and, at the same time, encouraging others to publish their mobile numbers (via leaflet drops and social media).

An innovation this year has been to offer local businesses the opportunity of having their adverts printed in colour. This idea was readily accepted. The directory covers the wider Waihi area to include the Beach, Waikino and Athenree. It is a free publication and available at a variety of outlets.

The book has always been popular with local folk because of its clear and easy to read format a well as the local information that it provides.

When all bills are paid the club's Charitable Trust will benefit by close to \$30 000.





Remember, an amount of \$15 per member from your Trust (Activities) Account is a suggestion, but whatever you choose is great.




