

It follows a woman who, each year, goes into schools and assembles a choir to put on a concert. The children experience so much in their journey. They go away on a camp to practice, often leaving home for the first time. They then perform a concert. The children develop over their year with the choir and for some are offered scholarships to study music and dance at schools in Australia. Clubs should contact the partner/family of the deceased member directly in order to arrange their attendance and meal requirements.



Convention Voting.....

- Clubs must be financial to vote all annual dues must have been paid in full at least 15 days before the start of Convention. Clubs & voting delegates must be in good standing.
- Voting delegates must be accredited by the close off time on the morning of the Business Session (2 April 2022).
 - The standard club constitution states: "... club shall be entitled to send its full quota of delegates to all such conventions and have power to pay the necessary expenses of such delegates attending such conventions. This club shall be entitled in each annual convention of its district ... to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each ten (10) members who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in this club, or major fraction thereof, of this club as shown by the records of the international office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held... The major fraction referred to in this section shall be five (5) or more members."
- Therefore, as of 31 March 2022 a club of 16 (with members of at least a year & a day) will
 receive two votes, as will one of 24 members, those votes being either the club appointed
 voting delegates or a club appointed substitute (the alternate) for an appointed delegate who
 has to withdraw.
- Any members joining after 30 March 2021 are not counted towards the club's eligible voting numbers.
- 202J Past International Directors have full delegate status independent of their club's delegate quota
- The standard club constitution states: "Each certified delegate present in person shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote of his/ her choice for each office to be filled by, and one (1) vote of his/her choice on each question submitted to, the respective convention."

Therefore, voting decisions are the choice of the voting delegates during the Convention business session, not decided by the club.

Executive Summary Council Of Governors Meeting Held 20-21 November 2021



Lions Clubs New Zealand

Cancer Screening Vehicle Trust: The Council of Governors after review of the project feasibility study has given permission for the Lions Clubs Skin Cancer Screening Service to proceed. The formalisation of the governing Trust and its charitable registration is still in process and expected to be a further 12 weeks away.

ANZI: ANZI 2022 will be in Cairns 22-25 September. The confirmed dates for ANZI in 2023 is 1–3 September 2023 in Queenstown.

ANZI NZ Standing Representative: This position is currently held by PCC Arvind Raman and the threeyear term was due to end on 30 June 2022. As PCC Arvind is the current ANZI Committee Chair a decision was made to extend the term for a further year to 30 June 2023 at which time the role will be vacated and re advertised.

Public Relations & Communications Committee: Our Website Administrator Alan Gray is asking for your feedback on the content on the NZ Lions Website; please email him on md202.webadmin@lionsclubs.org.nz.

Private Members Website: A private members website area has been approved and development of the site and its trial is to occur between now and 30 June 2022 when Lions members will be provided with access. This private member area will provide a secure location for the storage of District and Multiple District Documents and the electronic Multiple District Directory.

Training: The GAT team have been working hard to deliver additional training. Online training has been delivered on Building a Vision and was well received by those that attended. Members are encouraged to take up the opportunities for training as they arise. Upcoming training includes ELLI to be held in Christchurch 14-16 January 2022, ALLI in Brisbane 4-6 February 2022 and LCIP in Christchurch 11-14 February 2022. GLT Leaders are encouraged to record all training on MyLCI for the individuals trained and for those delivering the training.

Leos Video Contest: There is currently a competition running for MD202 Leos to produce a video that shows the public what the Leo programme is, the benefits of membership and how their Leo club has served safely. Entries close 13 February 2022.

Legal: There has been considerable work occurring on the issues that have arisen out of COVID and the development of a Guidance Statement which has recently been circulated to clubs. Every group, Multiple District, Districts, clubs and Conventions Committees will now need to put in place their own policy for assessing every event they run and a policy on Vaccination status. Members cannot be excluded from their own meetings and where a policy may require them to not attend in person some form of virtual attendance should be provided.

Executive Summary (cont'd)



Wellington Children's Hospital Playscape: Fundraising for this project has achieved its target and funds have been set aside for additional signage. Work is underway to ensure media coverage or video footage is obtained on the opening of this facility. Currently LCIF intend to send a film crew to cover this however if they are unable to do so due to COVID restrictions MD202 will arrange for this locally.

Starship Fundraising Project: The funds currently donated and pledged to this project are sitting at \$231,000 with donations received at \$113,000. In order to make an application to LCIF for a matching grant, donations received must equal the equivalent of \$US100,000. Once that is achieved an application will be made to LCIF.

Child Cancer Foundation: Work is continuing on developing an MOU between Lions and the Child Cancer Foundation (CCF). By establishing a formal MOU Lions Clubs New Zealand will obtain public recognition and profile with CCF. At the current level of donations being made by clubs directly to CCF Lions Clubs New Zealand would be recognised with Super Sponsor Status.

Lions Christmas Cakes: Sales of Christmas cakes are going well and as at 20 of November only 2,000 cakes remained, and further orders were to be extended for a further 10 days.

MD Convention 2022: Preparation is continuing for the 2022 MD Convention and contingency planning is being developed to allow for a virtual convention in the event of numbers of attendees being limited under the new traffic light system. Physical attendance at the MD Convention will require attendees to have a valid COVID pass.

Reminder remits for Conventions must be provided 60 days before the Convention and should be checked by the MD Legal Counsel before presentation to ensure they are legal.

Rowing Fundraiser: The Rowing Fundraiser is a great opportunity for fundraising for several of our Lions Charities and a great opportunity for clubs to be involved in their various regions. Further information will be circulated as this comes to hand.

Youth Review: A report on a review of the various Youth Portfolios has been undertaken and as a result a new position of Youth Chair is to be created from 1 July 2022. The job description is currently being developed and the role will be advertised in early 2022.

MD202 GAT Team Leaders: These positions which currently cover the roles of Leadership, Membership and Service are currently one-year terms and are advertised and appointed annually. Due to the nature of the roles, it was felt that three-year terms with annual performance reviews would be more effective. The current position holders have all indicated they would be willing to continue for another year and their positions will be extended for a further one-year term to 30 June 2023 when the new three-year positions are introduced.

Executive Summary (cont'd)



Taranaki Winter Youth Camp: -The winter camp is to run at the Taranaki Outdoor Pursuit and Education Centre (TOPEC) in New Plymouth from 10th – 16th of July 2022. Registrations will open on the 1st of February.

Council Policies: Various existing policies were reviewed and a new policy on Bullying and Harassment was approved. A copy of this will be circulated in the upcoming Between the Lions as it will be useful for all Lions Entities.

Council Ethics: District 202E wished to update the wording of the Lions ethics to everyday language. PID Sheryl Jensen has investigated this with LCI Legal and found this is a Board policy which cannot be changed without the lodging and subsequent passing of a remit. This would require District 202E to pass such a remit, for it to be passed at MD202 and then subsequently passed at LCI. At this stage, the matter will be taken back to the District 202E cabinet to discuss.

Focus on Zone 3 News

Diabetes: Oamaru, North Otago, Waiareka Valley Lions Clubs had a successful Diabetes Type 2 free blood sugar test day in November to raise the awareness of Diabetes. It was well supported and received good coverage in the local media.

♣ Palmerston:

Unable to use their regular meeting place, Palmerston have improvised by having potluck tea meetings at the sports hall in the afternoon. Ongoing activities are fertiliser drive, Pink Ribbon collection, selling lily bulbs and bagging manure.

Waianakarua:

Have been busy getting McKerrow's Pond ready for teaching school kids – sailing and kayaking. Over the last year the club has replaced the kayak fleet, lifebelts, the chase dinghy and enlarged the deck and sun shelter. The club has experienced sailing and kayaking trained volunteers that assist during school visits.

Waiareka Valley:

Had a great 40-year celebration meeting at which five charter members (four still active) were present. The club is busy planning and preparing for the "winter crop" competition that they run with the Waianakarua club. Last year, it raised \$70,000 for the Rescue Helicopter and St John. In the meantime, they are busy on ongoing activities of manure bagging, firewood and collection of batteries which is a surprisingly good money earner.

• North Otago:

The club organised a very successful "Toot for Tucket". It was well supported by the Oamaru, Waianakarua and Waiareka Valley Lions Clubs as well other community and youth groups. What is gratifying to see is the increased participation by members of the public encouraged by the companies that they work for.

♣ Oamaru:

Busy with fundraiser "Oamaru Calendar", lime & Lions Mints sales, Meals on Wheels, North Otago Rugby gates, Noddy Train & BBQ at a Christmas function, and enjoyed giving Noddy Train rides to little kids at a Kindergarten Christmas function.

Waimate:

Have had a great start to the Lions year by recruiting two new members and dropping the club's average age by 15 years. Their sponsorship of two men to the Lions Berwick Outdoor Experience paid off as they came back and joined the club.

♣ Waimate Whitehorse:

Had an enjoyable zone meeting in Waimate, well organized by the club. Club has been busy with movies fundraiser, Pink Ribbon collections and raffles, and social activities such as lunch with North Otago Lions. It is great to see more social interaction between Lions clubs.



Campaign 100 Update:

To date \$US245,294,791 which is 81.8% of Campaign 100's goal to raise \$US300 million by June 2022 has been raised. USA tornadoes:

Installation of bus shelter, firewood splitting, and fence and tidy up around commercial building.


♣ Temuka District:
