

NEW MEMBER REMINDER


Due to the impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic Lions Clubs International has extended the waiver of new members fees from July 1st through to 30 June 2022. Get new members recorded on MyLCI before that date to obtain the waiver.

LCI DIRECT DEBIT
