Message from Pam Fiveash

District Governor 202F District

The time for our virtual convention on Saturday 26 March is drawing near, and plans are well in hand. I've been fortunate to have the assistance of Past District Governors Lynette Batt, Liz Murray and Wendy Goodwin, as their knowledge and experience has been invaluable. Mind you, in saying that, this is totally new territory for all of us.

Three districts in our Multiple District have already had their virtual webinars, and to be able to sit in on those has been extremely valuable. All three have been completely different, probably just as would happen in a face-to-face convention, as each District Governor puts their own spin on how things are run.

As you may remember, we did on-line voting back in 2020 when then District Governor Dave Saunder's convention was cancelled. However this time it's going to be a little different. We're going to be using the Zoom Webinar model, which is slightly different to a normal Zoom meeting. But in my experience so far, it doesn't appear to be too difficult, and I'm hoping that a lot of you will join in the meeting, whether you're a voting delegate or not. As I said in last month's article, club members may like to gather in one place and make a bit of a special event of it – COVID willing of course. The main thing would be to ensure everyone can do this safely.

Our Multiple District, 202, is funding the webinar, and the link moves from one District to another the week of each meeting. We won't get access to it until Monday 21 March, at which time it will be forwarded to club secretaries to share with their fellow members. And the club delegates are getting voting information from our Convention Liaison, Lynette Batt. If you have any questions about the process, feel free to contact her on 202f.voting@lionsclubs.org.nz.

And remember, our candidates for District Governor, Vice District Governor, and Lloyd Morgan Lions Club Charitable Trust need your support. Even though they may be the only person standing for each role, their success is dependent on receiving 50% plus one of the eligible votes. And unfortunately there is no candidate for 2nd Vice District Governor at the moment, and we're unable to call for

nominations from the floor on the day of the virtual convention. Our District Leaders will be looking to fill this role by following the process set down in our District Constitution. So it's going to be a case of 'watch this space'.

Humankind has been facing immense challenges in recent times; the devastation in Tonga from the volcanic eruption and tsunami that followed, the flooding in Australia, the Russian invasion of Ukraine, the COVID-19 pandemic, to name just a few. Yet through all of this, our Lions Clubs International Foundation has supported Lions' relief efforts globally with millions of dollars in grants. And to maintain this level of assistance, in 2018 the most ambitious fundraising initiative to date was introduced. The aim of Campaign 100 has been to raise US\$300million by 30 June this year. As at 4 March 2022 we have achieved 86.5% of the total goal, but with time running out, and the needs of our fellow man seeming even greater, have you thought about making a personal donation to LCIF? Details are on the Lions website, and our District Coordinator, Maree Hayes, is only too willing to help. If you have any questions, she can be contacted at maree.hayes@justice.govt.nz. Remember, where there's a need, there's a Lion.

Hello everyone

This month I want to focus on Why Service Reporting Matters. To begin with though it is not long until your Club will be seeking nominations for office bearers. Did you know that it does not have to be your Club Secretary who puts in the MMR or the Service Reporting each month for your Club? When you are entering your new office bearers for the 2022/23 year you can add, for example, a Club Administrator and that person can take on the role of reporting your Club's activities for the month.

At the moment throughout District 202F we have nearly half of our Clubs putting in their Service Reporting and we really want all Clubs doing this. So where do we begin?

The starting point for Cabinet is that I will be contacting the Secretaries of our Clubs who are not doing Service Reporting. We need to know why this is not happening and how we can help your Club. We have a team of Lions who are happy to give a helping hand so I do hope you will take up this offer. I then want to have a chat with Secretaries who are doing Service Reporting as the may have some good ideas around the value of Service Reporting.

WHY SERVICE REPORTING MATTERS:

- ➤ People want to participate in real, visible change. Service reporting allows Lions Clubs to continually engage their communities, tell their story more effectively, and ultimately grow their member base. This can all encourage new members to join Lions.
- ➢ Discover what can happen when you share with others what your Club is doing. It can be what occurred at your monthly meeting, to an act of kindness, to a Project. Entering your voluntary hours including your Office Bearers time is all part of Service Reporting. Your ideas can help other Clubs as well.
- Clear, relevant service data ensures people in need know exactly where to go for help.
- > Increase global awareness. Service data helps people understand

the needs of communities around the world. Global-minded Lions identify opportunities and lead their local communities into action.

- Pave the way to partnership. Service reports provide tangible evidence to prospective partners of Lions International's global engagement and impact. These relationships strengthen the organization and yield benefits at the local level.
- ➤ Uncover the next big idea. Because service activities are scalable, one small service project can become the next signature initiative of the organization: but only if it is reported and promoted by Lions!
- Enhance our support. Service data—along with peer-to-peer sharing and feedback from Lions—enables Lions International to identify best practices that can be shared globally.
- Build a brighter future. Measurement leads to insight, which in turn sharpens our focus. Setting higher—and more reachable goals each year both unifies and mobilizes the organization toward growth.
- Service reports show how Lions and Leos around the world are using funds from Lions Clubs International Foundation grants to serve their communities. This visibility encourages Lions to think creatively about their own projects and apply for LCIF grants themselves.
- Recognize and reward. When Lions report service, they become eligible for a number of service awards. From Centennial Service Challenge patches to Leo Awards, rewards recognize the hard work of Lions and motivate them to continue striving for excellence.

KINDNESS MATTERS

I realise we are all living in a state of flux at the moment as Omicron is weaving itself through our communities, but I believe that Lions is a great organisation to belong to and with that in mind I have been in touch with the Zone Chairs to ask them to contact your Club. What I

Please take a look, you will be surprised at how simple and easy some of these ideas are.



Our communities need our Service now more than ever before. Not money, but Service.




