
The seat had its first use by a member of the public before we had even left and her comment was that it was a great place for the seat and she would be making regular use of it.

The 20 ft container was generously stationed at R&R Hiab's Cromwell yard and the R&R's facilities with staff assistance, became the receiving point for all goods. R&R's generosity also extended to machinery use and transporting the container.

There are many more people we do not know who have been so generous and are not mentioned above – we apologise for omitting a personal recognition.

A total of about \$5,160 in cash donations were used by the Tongan people to buy food to put in the container ie; Clyde Lions money brought a pallet of bags of rice - \$1,135

Finally, within 4 weeks of the initial interest meeting, the container was filled to brim – nothing else could have been squeezed in.

People keep giving, 2 x 44-gallon drums of food arrived 2 days after container left – this was donated to food bank.

The container is presently on the water and will arrive in Tonga on 18-April-22

sorting a fadge of aluminium per week for the first three weeks of an inter
house competition to gather the most aluminium. In the fourth and final
week they more than doubled the weekly total and had more than two

Each fadge is worth approximately \$50 for Kidney Kids and the children and school were ecstatic to hear that their efforts contributed more than \$250 to a cause that was very close to home as I found out, one girl's younger brother was recently born with kidney defects.

The school also assisted with the Tongan appeal, and Cromwell Lions President Russ Fowler proudly presented the schools house leaders with the Lion of the Month award for March. Russ also made them honorary Lions for the remainder of the year as he's sure Lions will collaborate with them further.

Andy Andrews of Cromwell Lions is collecting any and all aluminium, along with beer bottle tops. (Dave Rule found this out when he put an aluminium can in the bin and his granddaughter from Cromwell Primary reprimanded him as she needed it for her houses collection). Wine caps and necks along with the tabs from aluminium cans fetch a high price due to their grading and should be sorted separately.

#### Fire Brigade Emergency Stretcher

The Emergency Stretcher funded by the Alexandra Lions Club's 4WD Safari earlier in the year was finally handed over to the Alexandra Volunteer Fire Brigade on Monday evening, 4th April 2022. The stretcher has one wheel on the underside and can be used on any of the cycle trails in Central Otago, only needing 2 people to carry patient out. It folds up and can be carried in the brigades 4WD vehicle, not needing to use a Fire Engine. Before getting this stretcher, it would take 6 Firemen to carry a patient out and in places the trails were too narrow for them to easily get them out. The stretcher came at a cost \$4100.00 and was donated to the Volunteer Fire Brigade, who will be making extra good use of it.


