The Volcanic eruption experienced in Tonga with devastation felt in widespread communities last year; there has been a total of nine water tanks and guttering equipment systems being provided for nine schools. The installation of this massive project is happening as you read your contact magazine. I will send you the photos once they have been received.

There will always be a need to be a Lion. Just look at the devastation felt in Pakistan lately. Recent record-breaking monsoon rains and floods have washed away villages, destroyed livelihoods and killed more than 1,000 people. Dear Club President,

SPIRIT OF ADVENTURE TRUST – Proposed voyage on the Sailing Training Ship "Spirit of New Zealand" for young people with physical disabilities – "The Inspiration Voyage 2023"

The Lions Club of Karori again needs your help in raising funds to repeat this New Zealand-wide project. We have received permission from the Multiple District Council to write to all Lions Clubs in New Zealand to let you know about this annual project and to offer you the opportunity to contribute if you wish.

(Please note: while we have permission to canvas all clubs, this is not a Multiple District Project)

The Spirit of Adventure Trust (SOA TRUST) is planning a voyage that will leave from Auckland on 16 February 2023 for up to 30 young people aged 16 to 20 with physical disabilities, including a number with visual and hearing impairments. These young people often lead sheltered lives and lack opportunities to take part in challenging activities and can be denied the chance to test themselves and discover their hidden strengths and abilities, as opposed to disabilities. This can result in low self-esteem and lack of confidence and a voyage on the "Spirit of New Zealand" does much to overcome this. Past experience has shown a very marked improvement in the youngsters' self-confidence and independence after a voyage, and this carries over into their daily lives. The **trainees** are typically 15 males and 15 females and will be drawn **from throughout the whole of New Zealand**.

NOTE - the 2023 sailing will mark the 25th Anniversary of Lions NZ sponsorship of this amazing voyage.

The SOA Trust sends information to schools each year and generally the trainees are nominated by the schools, however Lions Clubs may make direct nominations to the SOA Trust via the link above and we strongly urge clubs to proactively make an effort to do this. The Trust fills the 30 places on the voyage from the list of nominees. Because of the need to have funding secured, and because of the health issues faced by some of the potential trainees, we understand that the final selection is made relatively close to the date of sailing. Hence names and locations of trainees are not available until that late stage. Lions Clubs are not involved at all in the selection process.

Once the selection is finalised, the Voyage Coordinator may forward to us details about the home location of the various youth whom this project will sponsor. On inquiry, we can then let you know whether, and how many, trainees from your geographical area were selected. In the past, following the sailing, some participants have been willing to speak about their experiences to Lions Clubs in their vicinity. Interested Clubs should approach the SOA Trust after the sailing (Ph 09 373 2060) to determine whether there are any young people from the latest voyage in their area who would be willing to speak to Lions Clubs about their experiences.

The additional costs for the voyage that require sponsorship run to over \$20,000.00 and with your help we have managed to raise this amount for the annual sailing every year for the 24 years that the project has been running to date, and we hope to do so again for the 2023 sailing – the 25th year that Lions has sponsored this project.

The participants each contribute \$600.00+ towards their expenses, although this amount can also be sponsored for an individual. Some Lions Clubs in New Zealand both nominate and sponsor a young person in this way, which is greatly appreciated as often families with higher needs children can be financially compromised.

Our club cannot finance this project independently and we really need the help of all clubs that are willing to participate. We would appreciate any donation that your club sees fit to make to this project. The monies will be held in the Spirit of Adventure Trust Project Account of the Lions Club of Karori Charitable Trust until shortly before the voyage.

The old professor answered, 'Yes, I remember the situation with the stolen watch, which I was looking for in everyone's pocket. I didn't remember you, because I also closed my eyes while looking.'

This is the essence of teaching:

If to correct you must humiliate; you don't know how to teach."

Child Mobility Foundation:

Hi everyone, can you keep children with mobility issues in your area in mind please, we maybe able to help them through the Child Mobility Foundation. A child needs to be referred through me to CMF, they are then assessed and if a Hart Walker can help them, then CMF work with the child, family and us to get a Hart Walker for them. A Lions club or zone is then asked to sponsor the child and build a relationship with the family. It is a long process to get a child into a Hart Walker and a lot of money needs to be raised by Lions Clubs, families and CMF.

Child Mobility Foundation is like everyone else and needs funds to operate. A Specialist is bought over from Australia twice a year to assess the child and adjust the Hart Walker according to their needs. CMF hold clinics in Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch, to which the child and family must get to from wherever they live. I am expected to attend clinics too, and if I can't go I can ask someone else to. This is important for family/Lions relationships and keeping contact details of the child up to date.

CMF asks Clubs to make a donation to them if they can, each year to run the free clinics and run the rest of the CMF operation. We can donate them the profits from our Christmas cake sales, run a project to raise money for CMF or just make a donation. It will be greatly appreciated as every dollar helps this worthy cause which makes a child's life better in so many ways.

Collecting Kan Tabs, old money and glasses. Keep up the good work here too, kan tabs help children get Liver transplants, old money helps children go to camps, learn multiple things and Lions Clubs to provide learning and adventure for children. Glasses are recycled for children in areas like South Auckland and over in the Islands where there is great need and very little resources, so keep on with these very worthwhile projects and make someone's life, somewhere all the better for your help.
