

Bright new seating at Rhoda Read Continuing Care

The Morrinsville Lions Club, and The Morrinsville Lons Club, and the Friends of Morrinsville Charitable Trust, have combined forces to provide Rhoda Read Continuing Care with extra seating. There are six brightly coloured standard chairs, four in the reception

area, two in the 'quiet room,' and two recliner chairs. The chairs in reception are used by patients who are more mobile.

The new chairs reach health and safety infection control standards, as they have a durable surface which can

they have a durable surface which can be wiped with antiseptic wipes. "Our previous chairs did not meet infection control standards because they were upholstered in fabric," said Rhoda Read Continuing Care Charge Nurse Gina Chaney. "This meant we couldn't clean them."

The staff chose the colours, from the range offered. "We also had physiotherapy input into the decision. We looked at the height of the seat,

easily. Also is there something to push

easily. Also is there something to push up from, and how high is the back."

The previous chairs were quite low, and difficult to get in and out of. "These are a better height," Gina said. "We can get out of these chairs real easy," said patient John King.
"The process has taken a couple of months, said John Petry, from the Friends of Morrinsville Charitable Trust." I phoned Gina to see if there

Trust. "I phoned Gina to see if there was anything Rhoda Read needed. She mentioned that their fabric chairs needed replacing, and the process

needed replacing, and the process started."

"We had to purchase them from an approved DHB supplier," said Gina.
"The material they are made from has to withstand several years of being wiped down with antiseptic wipes."

The total cost has been more than \$10,000, which was shared between the Morrinsville Lions Club, and the Friends of Morrinsville Charitable

Catering to raise funds for the community

The Morrinsville Lions Club arekeen to cater for your next event!

They have a brand new, purpose-built trailered barbecue, which comes completely staffed, and can produce a wide range of meals for any sized crowd.

It's taken twelve months to complete the project, with most of the work

done by Lions Club members. "There are a lot of very clever people in our club, and also local businesses have been very helpful," said Kevin Richards, Lions Club President.

There are two six-burner gas barbecues, two large hotplates, a stainless-steel preparation bench and cooler units.

"It's really unlimited as to what sort of event it can be used at," Kevin added.

"It's going to be used for community fundraising, with all funds raised going back into the local community."

While the actual idea for the BBQ on a trailer came from Steve Davis, Stu Robinson owns a café, and the basic design was his work. "Over a beer or two," said Steve.

"Food safety is paramount," said Stu. "That's why it's all stainless steel."

"We can do anything from a basic barbecue to gourmet burgers, and even a full roast dinner," said Steve.

The Lions are in the process of forming a subcommittee to manage the trailer.
