

Safety should not be a priority for Lions?

I would imagine right now you have read the title and already have questions about where I am going with this, which is great. That means the title has done its job and caught your attention. You are maybe surprised to hear someone in the safety field say that safety should not be a priority, but please bear with me, I will explain to you why it should not.

It is time we stopped viewing safety as just three 'pieces of paper' on the Lions website, safety is about members! It is about our people and focusing on the safety of the work we do is in fact in itself an act of service.

For some of you, this view turns the whole idea of health and safety on its head, a 180° turn as it were. Safety should not be a priority. The inherent problem with making anything a priority is admitting at the outset that it is subject to change.

What typically happens with priorities? As I mentioned above, priorities change, safety goes out the window when there is a change in routine or environment. When the pressure gets intense, priorities shift, and safety is no longer the big focus it was at the beginning of the activity. So how do we get our members to focus on safety all the time? The answer to that question is, we must make safety a part of what we do. It should not be something extra.

Safety is and must always remain a value, as our values remain the same. Obviously, we place high value on our members, then by the same measure we should value safety and the safety of service. This shift recognises that safety is not a bureaucratic task as in the past, but in fact an ethical responsibility to ourselves and other members.

With this responsibility in mind, the existing documents that sit on the Lions website no longer align, a new 'safety toolbox' made up of a balance of tools and rules has been developed over the last year with the assistance of Clubs and individual Lions in 202L, as required additions will be co-developed to support specific gaps that exist. In order to make these tools useful requires Lions at 'the sharp end' of service to contribute to the development.

Having the tools is great however, in response to the growing interest in a more proactive approach to safety across the country. I am really excited to roll out a series of Zoom meetings throughout August-September to unpack our new safety tools. LIONS YOUNG LEADERS IN SERVICE AWARDS



This award recognises youth aged from 12 years old for their commitment to community service over a ten-month period from February 1st to November 30th.

There are two awards available: 50 hours of community service 100 hours of community service

Types of service could be:

Community groups, religious agencies, or institutions
Service through a school-based group or courses
Individual efforts to help others. E.g., Coaching or refereeing of sports
Scouting groups
St John

Why not invite your children/ grandchildren along to help in your club's service activities and get them involved with Lions now?

All you must do is supply applicants with a Service Tracking record form. These are available from your Youth Chairman so that progress can be monitored.

The forms must be collected before the closing date of **November 30th** of each year and returned to your District Youth Chairman. The certificate will arrive directly to your club. You will need to organise a time to present the certificate to your applicant, perhaps at a club meeting would be suitable.

The District Youth Chairperson would like to attend a presentation where possible.

This can be a steppingstone to further youth activities both within your club and for the youth involved.




Attention All Treasurers

Denis Hurcomb, 202D 1st VDG from Kaponga installed the new board.














