From PDG Simon Williams:

Thank you to the 4 Clubs in District 202D (Kairanga, Hawera Club Branch, Papaioea Rose City & Opunake Lakeside) who have donated to this worthwhile cause. We know how important it is to have Palmerston North as one of the key points in this life saving service.

I am pleased to advise that we have received a \$50,000.00 grant from LMLCCT. The application has been sent to LCIF for a matching grant of USD \$150,000.00, which will be discussed and decided on at their May meeting.

A little bit of background...

Life Flight, which operates the Wellington-based Westpac Rescue Helicopter and a growing fleet of air ambulances nationwide, has expanded its critical aeromedical services in the central North Island by adding a 4th ambulance plane which is based permanently at Hamilton Airport.

Life Flight, a non-profit organisation, has been a cornerstone in providing urgent aeromedical care for patients around the country for almost 50 years.

With the support of NZCT, and other generous funders including Pub Charity, Lions clubs, and Rotary clubs, Life Flight is growing its critical air ambulance services to respond to an increased need from the community for its life-saving services. Through the new aircraft (2024) Life Flight is not just adding an additional aircraft to its fleet but extending a lifeline to those in need of time-critical medical care across Waikato, Bay of Plenty, Taranaki, Northland, Gisborne and Manawatū-Whanganui.
