## **RECRUITING NEW MEMBERS**

Recruiting members can be one of the more challenging parts of starting a new club. However, this can be overcome by building a team that is organized, well trained and focused. Here are some tips from club chartering experts:

Have your team complete the New Club Development and Invite for Impact courses in the Lions Learning Center.

Your district can also host a Just Ask! workshop to learn how to recruit strategically.

Recruiters should have a practiced elevator speech to explain why they are a Lion. People want to hear personal stories, not just a list of benefits. We created a tip sheet to help you write an impactful elevator speech.

Work with the district marketing chairperson to develop district marketing plans that strengthen and support your team's club chartering recruitment strategy.

The Marketing Matters webpage is packed with practical tools and resources to help bring plans to life.

Focus your recruitment efforts on local leaders (government officials, school principals, civic leaders) to raise the profile of the new club.

Encourage new members to bring their friends and family to serve with them and learn about Lions.

Be upfront with dues. People are more willing to pay the dues if they are made aware of them from the beginning and are shown the value they will receive.

Of course, the key to success in recruiting charter members is perseverance. Not everyone will accept your invitation and that's ok. It might not be a definite "no," but more of a "not now." Even if it's a definite "no," just move on to the next recruit and give it your best shot.

Always remember, the biggest reason why someone isn't a Lion is because no one has invited them yet. That's why our recruiting guide is called Just Ask!.
