I recently had the privilege of representing Lions at a breakfast hosted by Volunteering NZ and our Minister of Social Development, Louise Upston, at Parliament.



This event, celebrating Volunteer Week, was an opportunity to connect with fellow volunteers and hear directly from those shaping the future of volunteering in Aotearoa. What I observed painted a clear picture of both the immense value and the urgent challenges facing our volunteer landscape.

Volunteering isn't just a good deed in New Zealand; it's the very fabric of our communities. Government leaders recognize that volunteers are integral to building stronger, more resilient communities, often serving as the "backbone" in times of crisis, not merely a "backup plan." This was strongly emphasised by the head of the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), who lauded volunteers for their indispensable role in responding to natural disasters.

Yet, despite this vital role, a concerning trend has emerged: **most volunteer organisations are facing declining numbers.**

While it's inspiring to know that 53% of New Zealanders, and a remarkable 47% of young people, currently volunteer – figures far higher than commonly perceived – the challenge lies in retaining and engaging them.

People volunteer for a vast array of reasons, driven by a desire to serve. However, what truly keeps them coming back isn't just the cause; it's the **social connection and fellowship** they find.

This insight is crucial for us, as Lions. People are short on time and often juggle multiple causes. They will quickly disengage if they don't feel their efforts are genuinely making a difference. **People are looking to make an impact, not just to show up**. By helping others, we are saying that they are seen and that they matter. We are here to help change lives.

Many of you recently celebrated Volunteering Week by connecting with your broader volunteer community. Now, it's time for us to step up and **take a leading role**. We must ensure all our collective efforts are not just activities or projects, but **meaningful initiatives that clearly demonstrate their value**.

Let's seize this incredible potential.

Together, we can make a real, lasting impact!

This time last year our District Governor Denis Hurcomb's name was chosen, at random by incoming International President Fabricio Olivera to receive a grant of US\$10,000 to spend on a project of his choice in his district. Much work followed, led by GST Coordinator Graham Robinson to come up with a worthwhile project that would benefit the whole of the district and meet the strict criteria set by LCI.

Fast forward to now and not one but two projects have been approved.

- Project #1 With the support of clubs in the upper part of the district to fund a virtual play area and a reception area in the new Cancer Wing of Taranaki Base Hospital
- **Project #2** With support of clubs in lower part of the district to fund **point of care testing for diabetes** particularly in pregnancy & antenatal care.

IPDG Denis would like to sincerely thank all clubs for their contributions which have made his initial US\$10,000 go so much further and make so much possible across the district. We will add details and photographs as these projects are progressed.

In 2023 Ian Hamilton, a well known rowing enthusiast and coach decided to get a crew together and row the East Coast of NZ, fundraising for four charities, Child Cancer Foundation, Starship Hospital, Surf Lifesaving NZ and the Lions Skin Cancer Screening vehicle. Ian partnered with Lions NZ to help along the way, with Lions clubs supporting with encouragement, food, accomodation and fundraising as well as plenty of enthusiasm as they began the row from the bottom of the South Island.

Unfortunately COVID put a temporary stop to the adventure in 2024 at Kaikoura, after rowing 600kms. Weather conditions were also not kind.

Despite these and other setbacks, lan fully intends to be back in the water to finish this extraordinary event in the future and has a team of keen rowers who will support him in this charity row.

Lions NZ has been holding funds and has recently distributed the \$60,000 raised to date equally to the four charities, with the Lions Club Cancer Trust receiving \$15,000.

A huge thank you to lan for his amazing generosity and I am sure we all wish him well as he works through his challenges towards finishing this amazing journey on water.

This month marks an exciting step forward for Lions New Zealand as we begin the **trial phase** of the Lions Eye Health Program (LEHP) screening programme right here in Taranaki. For years, Lions in Australia have led the way in community vision screening, and recently we were fortunate to host **Irene and Martin Braddick**, who travelled across the Tasman to train our local volunteers. Their knowledge and passion have given us the tools to start this important project with confidence.

The **Hawera Lions Club** has taken the lead in this pilot programme, working with local schools and families to screen children's vision. The early results have already highlighted just how valuable this service will be. Teachers and parents alike have shared their appreciation for the chance to check children's eyesight in such an accessible way.

What's next:

We are currently refining our processes, testing our resources, and gathering feedback to ensure that when LEHP rolls out across New Zealand, it will be ready to make the biggest impact possible.

We are also developing clear guidelines and materials—including permission forms, information packs, and promotional resources, so clubs will have everything they need to get started when the programme expands beyond Taranaki.

Thank you to everyone involved in this early phase. From our trainers and supporters to the dedicated team at Hawera Lions Club, your commitment is laying the groundwork for a programme that will help countless children in the years to come.

Watch this space—the future of children's vision in New Zealand is looking brighter already.
