

The following procedure is to be followed:







The Skin Cancer Screening Vehicle

There has been much going on with the Skin Cancer Screening project since it was launched in Hanmer Springs in March.

It has really kicked into gear now with some of the initial 'teething' issues resolved and with the appointment of our Administrator Janet Walmsley.

Janet has streamlined the booking process as well as updated documents and worked tirelessly to ensure screeners are qualified and informed as to their expectations.



The vehicle has been busy with events in the South Island before coming briefly to the North Island early in October. This was coordinated (and paid for) by District 202L so the vehicle could be in attendance at the Waikato Home & Garden Show. While it was in the North Island we took advantage of it on its way back to the ferry. (This was only for a short time due to other bookings in the South Island).

At the time of writing there had been over 600 people screened with a 28% referral rate.

The vehicle is booked right through until the Multiple District Convention in April next year with a 5 day stay at the NZ Special Olympics in Christchurch early December.

A second vehicle is on the production line list with an anticipated completion being mid 2026 (could be earlier) so fundraising is still ongoing.
