lubs have been busy planning for the current year. Several clubs have inducted new members and other prospective members are due to join clubs. Prospective new member functions are being planned by some clubs. A summary of club highlights follows:

#### Hinds & Districts:

Raffling firewood with the proceeds going to support the Longbeach School Year 7 & 8 trip to Stewart Island. Hosted two Italian Lions exchange students. With the Geraldine Club planning to ride the Hurunui Bike Trail in November.

#### Ashburton Pakeke:

Planning underway for the year's projects. Continued support to the Day Care Centre with driving of its minivan and using members cars. Club meetings returning to the Hotel Ashburton due to demolition of current venue.

#### Ashburton:

The biennial Big Smoke versus Rural folk Team Challenge and auction was held. Over 300 people enjoyed the team antics and opened their wallets to purchase the wide range of auction items. The night raised \$31,983 which has been distributed evenly to the Ashburton Rowing Club for youth rowing, Basketball Mid-Canterbury for junior Basketball and the Club's Charitable Trust to support its youth activities.

The Club has agreed to support an investigation into the possibility of forming an Omega Leo Club (18 - 30 years) in the Ashburton area.

#### Mayfield & Districts:

Annual Charity Golf Tournament held with \$26,000 raised. Of this \$21,000 has been granted to the Ashburton District Suicide Prevention Programme and \$5,000 to St Vincent de Paul in memory of the support given to that organisation by a late club member over many years. Donated \$1,500 to Idea Services to assist with outings for its clients.

#### Rakaia:

In conjunction with the Ashburton District Council are planning a major upgrade to the Rakaia Salmon site. This to include new pathways, toilets and promotional billboards. Assisted at the Rakaia Pony Club Gymkhana with marquees and the food trailer. Sales of swedes and potatoes continues from its roadside stall.

#### Ashburton County:

Regular movie night held. Gatekeeping duties at representative rugby matches. Planning for the annual Toot for Tucker. Donations made to St John Health Shuttle, Ashburton Aged Concern, Kidney Foundation, Riding for the Disabled, Prostate Cancer.

#### Methven:

Had Ambassador of Ireland to New Zealand as guest and speaker. New projector and screen provided for United Rugby clubrooms where its meetings are held. Meeting with Civil Defence re plans for the area. Involved with a spec house to be built and sold as a fundraiser for the Methven Aged Care facility building fund.

# **Presentation of 24/7 Accessible Defibrillator (AED) Cabinets**

n 8<sup>th</sup> August a presentation luncheon was hosted by the Balmacewen Lions Club at the Otago Golf Club to mark the occasion of the presentation of Defibrillators (AEDs) 24/7 accessible cabinets to the 14 Dunedin City area Secondary Schools, this being the second stage of this project.

In total some 10 AEDs and 13 x24/7 accessible cabinets have been provided with seven of the schools receiving a St John training package in the use of AEDs for 20 staff/pupils.





This presentation saw the culmination of a two year project being undertaken by the Balmacewen Lions Club in conjunction with St John.

Based on a similar project having been undertaken by the Burgess Hill Lions Club in the UK, an approach was made to the Dunedin Secondary School Principals Association in 2017 to determine which schools would accept the receipt of an AED.

Initially, six schools, Bayfield HS, Kaikorai Valley HS, John McGlashan College, Taieri College, Queens High School and Tokomairiro High School accepted the offer of an AED and supportive training from St John.

# Presentation of 24/7 Accessible Defibrillator (AED) Cabinets

With some \$18,000 raised in 2017/2018 these six schools were presented with an AED along with a training package provided by St John.

A common issue raised by these schools was that of security of these life saving devices when located in public areas. The majority at that stage being located in foyers which are not available after school hours and during school holidays!



Knowledge of the availability of 24/7 secure cabinets that can be opened after a call to 111 and the entry code being made available prompted the Balmacewen Lions Club to further offer the provision of these cabinets to all Secondary schools and a further 4 AEDs to be located in high public use facilities such as Gymnasia, Performing Arts Centres etc. As a result of the Club's own fundraising and supportive contributions from The Lloyd Morgan Lions Clubs Charitable Trust, The Callis Trust, The Sargood Bequest, The DCC Community Grants, The Otago Trust, The Foodstuffs SI Community Trust and Wenita Forests a total to date of \$45,000 has been raised in order to fund this project and provide 10 AEDs and 13 secure cabinets to the recipient schools. With late requests from two of the 14 schools for a further AED to be positioned in a public place the Balmacewen Club is currently considering fund raising options to achieve this.

To meet these late requests would see the project pass the \$50,000 mark!


