District Governor David's Message for September

It looks like Spring is on its way with longer daylight hours generally warmer days and nights. Spring blossom is over for some plants, but just beginning for most fruit trees. Outdoor club programmes are more fun in better weather!

The measles outbreak is a potent reminder of the importance of some our international programmes. Back in May I commented that Lions Clubs International Foundation through our own contributions and a dollar for dollar donation from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation had managed to immunised 60 million people against the disease. This is the reason it is so important to support

LCIF and report all the time and money we raise and contribute. Here in New Zealand immunisation is free, but we have had a campaign by a few over many years, based on spurious pseudo science, advising parents not to immunise. Sadly, we are now reaping the "rewards" of that campaign.

In early October I will be asking each club to provide a full report on their work so far this year, including all money donated for local and international projects.

Heather and I have been visiting clubs and really enjoying seeing the way different clubs operate. You Know your communities better than I do, but few clubs have diverse membership in age, ethnicity and social standing. International President Choi is promoting We Serve through diversity. That also fits with my Know, Show and Grow theme. Just a few highlights from club visits so far. East Hamilton have an ex Leo University Student as a member and he and they plan to build on this, Huntly have a diverse age range and women members and now better represent their community. Great to induct 2 new members at Tauranga City Sunrise and one new member and present 2 Lloyd Morgan fellowships and a Melvin Jones Life Membership at Rotorua East at their 43rd Charter event. Katikati Pakeke had a fun evening with Maggie's riddles and members passions; they reported they are close to completing their Outdoor Gym in the local park. Our final visit this month was to Te Puke Kiwicoast who had an "International" night. Everyone brought either a memento from a country and\or dressed in ethnic clothes and told us how and why they had chosen this. Great fun and interesting that while there was quite a bit of Scottish heritage in costume, only one country was mentioned twice: Botswana.

One of my responsibilities is to report to Lions Club International on the clubs I visit so when I visit I try to find our as much as I can about how members view their club, what it is doing and what plans it has and whether or not it is facing significant problems that could jeopordise its future. I hope you are totally honest with me and the 2 Vice District Governors when we talk with you. Great to hear how many of the clubs are helping towards the provision of Activity Trolleys in our hospitals Keep up the good work and remember this district wide project is being co-ordinated through Welcome Bay club.

There are District events and Training opportunities coming up Please note and either come yourself or encourage others to attend. The MD Roadshow is particularly important for Treasurers, but other officers and members will also benefit. Plan for joining the Strides event for Diabetes. This is an International project so support it if you can. Unfortunately National Council Meeting is on in Wellington that weekend so I will use Google Maps and record my distance there to add to the local contribution. Margaret's Mumblings—Ist DG Margaret Gill.

What does our Multiple District levy pay for?

Essentially shared resources that all our clubs benefit from. This includes our NZ website, legal support and advice, insurance, directory, national office and administration.

A large portion of our MD levy goes toward running our MD office. There is some financial support from Lions International for the position of MD Secretary, but that does not fully fund the operation of the office. It is worth noting that as our membership numbers have fallen, the amount available from LCI has also fallen, but many of the costs have remained the same.

For the role of the MD Secretary, think of all the day to day correspondence, meeting management, marketing/public relations and financial transactions of your club and multiply that by about 100.

Our national office is a central point of contact for public enquiry via 0800 number, website & social media. They help with the content on our NZ website and maintain a presence on social media with regular Facebook posts. There is also significant administration associated with processing and shipping of club supplies, which are ordered from the US in bulk for quick supply to NZ clubs.

The MD Secretary also manages much of the day to day finances of the Multiple District, including the international banking transactions with LCI on behalf of clubs. When your club treasurer makes a payment to Lions International, that money doesn't actually leave NZ directly. Our MD office facilitates the international banking with LCI for us. All expense reimbursement for MD officers are processed by the MD Secretary as are most of the payments for things like International Youth Exchange, Speechmaker competition, etc.

A portion of your MD levy pays for insurance cover for all clubs. I would really encourage everyone to familiarise yourselves on this insurance cover and the things you need to do to make sure your club projects are covered. It is extremely important that you make sure every project is specifically recorded as a club project in the minutes of your meetings. Without that, any insurance claim will be instantly declined.

As with our District levy, a portion of the money we pay goes toward expense reimbursement for our MD officers to actually do the job they were elected or appointed to do. There are 4 Multiple District Council meetings each year which include the 7 District Governors, 1 Council Chairman, the 3 Global Action Team (GAT) MD Co-ordinators, and the 3 members of the Council Advisory Board. There is also usually 1 face to face meeting/training at the beginning of each year for all the District GAT co-ordinators. Face to face meetings and training do cost quite a lot of money, but in my experience are invaluable and cannot be completely replaced with tools like video conferencing. Phone and video conferencing are really good tools for maintaining communication with people you have already go to know but you do loose a lot of the subtle non-verbal communication that you can only get face to face.

There is still much more to know about the operation of our District and Multiple District finances which I can't fit in here (I have probably massively exceeded my word limit – sorry Ed). I would really encourage you to come along to the MD Roadshow sessions scheduled for November. More information about this is included in this edition of Noozletta.
