Leos and Youth in 202L – Aquinas Leos Club Fiji Trip.

On Sunday, 7th of July, 24 students and 8 adults departed Auckland international Airport for Nadi Airport, Fiji. The departure marked the end of 9 months of preparation, organization and fundraising, fundraising that was greatly assisted by the generosity of the Greerton Lions Club Charitable Trust and their \$5,000 donation.

The Aquinas College Annual Fiji Service Trip is a 10-day trip undertaken by Aquinas College Year 13 students, teachers and parents every year. Every year the group travels to Vanuakula, a small Fijian village located an hour's drive inland from Suva. This year, the services to the village included the building of 4 shower blocks, an outdoor kitchen area, concrete paving within the village, the setup of a library space, the repairs of the





village water piping system and the painting of various village buildings.

Maeroa Intermediate Leos

Hamilton Dinsdale Lions have sponsored the Leos club \$500 towards their upgrade of a gully area. The students have started clearing the area and have planted seedlings to sell next term. They plan to plant potatoes to harvest for Christmas too. They also raised \$700 from a school mufti day and are organizing the Peace Poster Competition at their school to be judged late October.

On September 21st six Dinsdale Club members rallied around and supported Youth Chair Michelle Houghton, with the 202L West Leos Development Day at Fraser High School in Hamilton. Web site:

Obviously LCI provides an extensive web site, both public facing and member resources. If you are unfamiliar with the range of resources available to you on the LCI web site, I would really encourage you to pay a visit, or get a tech savy friend to help you have a look around. It costs a lot to build and maintain web sites such those provided by MD202 and LCI make sure you use them widely.

Training & Development:

Separate to the www.lionsclubs.org web site, but also on the web, is the Lions Learning Centre (LLC). Here you will find a large range of online training modules covering a wide range of subjects of use to Lions members, locally for officer training and for Multiple district training, especially those in leadership roles. As well as online training, LCI also provides several leadership institutes. These are the Emerging Lions Leadership Institute (ELLI), the Advanced Lions Leadership Institute (ALLI), the Faculty Development Institute (FDI), and the Lions Certified Instructor Programme (LCIP). Each institute is 3 days long and LCI pays for all accommodation, meals, & course materials for all participants. If you are interested in finding out more, please contact our District Leadership Team Leader Suez Reid or visit the LCI web site and search for institute.

Officer Support: There is an international board of directors for our Association. International Directors (ID) are elected for a 2 year team on the international board, with half of the board being replaced each year. In NZ we share an ID with Australia & Indonesia. Obviously there are significant costs involved in holding international board meetings with ID's travelling from all over the world to participate. LCI provides for a lot of expense reimbursement for our District Governor to attend all the meetings and functions they are expected to participate in. Without this reimbursement from LCI the position of DG would be beyond the reach of many Lions. When international VIPs attend our NZ conventions, LCI has paid most of their expenses to get here. However, I would note, there are still some hosting expenses that NZ Lions (either MD, District, or the convention committee) have to cover.

Headquarters:LCI employs a number of people to run our international headquarters. Staff at headquarters provide support and material for all 1.4 million lions. Much of the material we get from LCI is also provided in up to 12 other languages.

Insurance:As well as the insurance cover we get as part of our levy to Multiple District, all Lions clubs are automatically covered by public liability insurance cover provided by LCI. I would encourage everyone to become familiar with what your club is (and isn't) covered for under these policies. For the LCI cover, go to the member resource centre at <u>www.lionsclubs.org</u> and find the link down the left hand side for insurance.

Brand:

One really big thing we get from being part of the International Association of Lions Clubs, is the strength of the Lions brand. We can't put a dollar value on this brand, but we all know the power of the Lions name. Which is why it is important that each club and each Lion is careful to not abuse our good name or behave in ways that brings our organisation into disrepute. Keep up the good work , We serve to bring Help and Hope!!

The Caslani Reserve playground in The Lakes now has a set of shade sails installed ready for summer. This installation is the culmination of a project coordinated by the newly formed 'Pyes Pa Tauriko Lions Club' and supported by the generosity of the local business community. Lions Club President Matthew Gill, who was instrumental in getting things underway, said that the project cost to manufacture and install the 4 shade sails was over \$30,000. He said that business owners (large & small) were very keen to support this worthy project and this enabled it to be completed within a



relatively short period of time. The project was delivered via a mixture of funding and/or services on site to help get the sails erected. The council also supported this initiative by approving the project plan. A few hundred people turned out for the official opening on Saturday (28 Sep) where they were treated to a free sausage sizzle, ice blocks, face painting, raffles, a bouncy castle and some beautiful singing provided by the local duo 'Just Friends'. It was great to see the shade sails in action as families enjoyed themselves at this popular playground. The event also provided an opportunity for the contributing businesses

to be personally acknowledged (with many in attendance) and publicly acknowledged by the unveiling of a permanent sign on display at the park. It was also great to have the support from members of other local Lions Clubs.

Thanks to those clubs who have a pest control programme operating.


Being spring, many of the little devastators will be producing babies so

New Voices

- Do you feel your Club needs invigorating?

If you feel this way, chances are others do too. Quietly ask a few. If yes, then ask for time at meeting to discuss it.

Here's my three step suggestion to revitalise your club.

First - review how your club operates. There is an excellent tool for this - the club quality initiative programme. Here is the link <u>https://lionsclubs.org/en/resources-for-members/resource</u> <u>-center/improving-club-quality</u> - scroll down and click on club quality initative. This will help your club to understand your club's strengths and weaknesses, and the values of your club. It will also help set some club goals for the club future. Do it with a view to fostering diversity in your club activities and membership.

Second- network in your community - ask your local community centre, daycares, plunket, schools, even your local council, how can we serve you? The Club quality initiative will guide you with this.

Third - have fun doing the service for community

You will grow your clubs connections and the value of your club in your community. When you ask people to join, they will want to join in having fun and being involved in their community. Be prepared that some might be more comfortable to just be friends of your club. Or maybe start a club branch if there is a group of people with different strengths and ideas to your own club.

We have trained Lions in our District who can guide your Club through this club review process if you wish.(Register for Guiding Lions Nov 3rd to become one of these people!! -Editor). Clubs that are revitalised, that have diversity and new members i.e. new voices, have done this process and are enjoying the rewards. You have nothing to loose and alot to gain
