

This article deals with LCI funds. Did you know that no dollars from your International dues actually go to the United States?

Yes - that is actually true.

LCI have a US\$ denominated bank account via Westpac for both LCI and LCIF, it is held in New Zealand. Not a single dollar from this goes to the US.

A common question is what are the funds used for?

LCI (Dues)

This covers the cost of Governor and LCI roles such as those for the Global Service Team. Primarily, it is used for training and development of NZ Lions and ultimately you as members should benefit from this.

LCIF

These funds are used for LCI funded projects in New Zealand and can range from assistance to our Pacific neighbours to large donations to assist the Christchurch region earthquakes.

So, the next time someone tells you that your Lions dues and donations to LCIF do not go to the US, l assure you that's true.
