- 2) And you have paid their new member fee to LCI
- 3) Email 202J treasurer Graeme Hathaway the members name and the month inducted

- 4) Include your club's administration account details – *important!*
- 5) If you have inducted more than one over a period of time, all details in the one email will suffice

Reimbursements will be paid in February 2020 and May 2020 and there is -
NO LIMIT to the number of claims a club can make before 30th June 2020!

This Cabinet initiative aims to encourage clubs to continue inducting new members whilst ensuring they are not financially disadvantaged.

Dues, Family Members & New Member Rebates

Thank you to those clubs who, within just seven days of receiving an invoice, paid their MD202 & District 202J Dues – your promptness is appreciated.

Family Members:

District keeps no records of Family Members, consequently their reduced dues are not shown on your invoice; however, if you have one or more, deduct their discount at the rate of \$4.125 per family member from your invoice total and pay the reduced balance

New Member Rebate:

This initiative by 202J Cabinet has so far had a limited response, so in an effort to generate more interest, the requirements have been simplified, to:-

- 1) If you have inducted a new member (*must be this Lions Year*)
- 2) And you have paid their new member fee to LCI
- 3) Email me the members name and the month inducted
- 4) Include your club's administration account details – *important!*
- 5) If you have inducted more than one over a period of time, all details in the one email will suffice

Thank you to all the clubs in 202J who have responded to the Australian bush fires by making a donation through LCIF. One can only imagine how they feel as they experience the anguish and devastation of an event such as this, in some cases losing their loved ones, their homes, farmland, pets and animals, with a lot losing everything they owned. Our District support through LCIF for this disaster, and the grants provided by LCIF internationally, will I am certain, help lift the load of the Australian Lions as they start the recovery process. With these bush fires the recovery will be ongoing for a long time, so it is not too late for clubs to make a donation through LCIF, **\$AU3,000** buys much needed water tanks. If your club was to sponsor a water tank, your club's name will be attached to it. All donations are MJF eligible.

In this last Lions year LCIF distributed \$US882,170 in grants to our Constitutional Area 7 with \$US160,000 coming to NZ Lions. During the same period the total donations to LCIF from NZ totalled \$US116,150. When you read and hear of other charitable organisations collecting for the Australian bush fires and the amount they actually hand on to the cause and what they retain for administration costs, it certainly makes us **proud to be a Lion where 100% of what we give goes to the cause.**



Campaign 100 – our aim is to be serving 200 million people in need by 2021 and to do this we need to raise \$US300 million. As you can appreciate your club's annual donation to LCIF has never been more needed.

A special NZ initiative for individual Lion members who would like to make a personal donation to our Foundation is the **\$2DROP** whereby individual members can donate \$NZ2 a week to one of the areas of focus - Humanitarian Efforts, Vision, Youth, Diabetes and Disaster Relief. If you would like to take part your LCIF club coordinator will have the information or contact me as District 202J Coordinator.

Is your club considering undertaking a humanitarian project in your area? If so, check out LCIF's various grants that may be available, remembering that no grants are made in retrospect.



Convention Voting.....

- ◆ Clubs must be financial to vote - all annual dues must have been paid in full 15 days (July 2016 Constitution) before the start of Convention. Clubs & voting delegates must be in good standing.
- ◆ Voting delegates must be accredited by the close off time on the morning of the Business Session (28 March 2020).
- ◆ The standard club constitution states:
"... club shall be entitled to send its full quota of delegates to all such conventions and have power to pay the necessary expenses of such delegates attending such conventions. This club shall be entitled in each annual convention of its district ... to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each ten (10) members who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in this club, or major fraction thereof, of this club as shown by the records of the international office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held... The major fraction referred to in this section shall be five (5) or more members."
- ◆ Therefore as at 1 February 2020 a club of 16 members will receive two votes as will a club of 24 members, those votes being either the club appointed voting delegates or a club appointed substitute (the alternate) for an appointed delegate who has to withdraw.
- ◆ Any members joining after 30 January 2019 are not counted towards the club's eligible voting numbers.
- ◆ The standard club constitution states:
"Each certified delegate present in person shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote of his/her choice for each office to be filled by, and one (1) vote of his/her choice on each question submitted to, the respective convention."
 Therefore, voting decisions are the choice of the voting delegates during the Convention business session, not decided by the club.
