How is COVID-19 spread?

March 2020

What is COVID-19?

COVID-19 is a new illness that can affect your lungs and airways. It's caused by a type of coronavirus. There are simple steps you can take to protect you and your family/whānau.



How is it spread?

COVID-19, like the flu, can be spread from person to person. When a person who has COVID-19 coughs, sneezes or talks, they may spread droplets containing the virus a short distance, which quickly settle on surrounding surfaces.

You may get infected by the virus if you touch those surfaces or objects and then touch your mouth, nose or eyes.

That's why it's really important to use good hygiene, regularly wash and thoroughly dry your hands, and use good cough etiquette.

What can I do to stop COVID-19 spreading?

- · Cough or sneeze into your elbow or by covering your mouth and nose with tissues.
- · Put used tissues in the bin or a bag immediately.
- · Wash your hands with soap and water often (for at least 20 seconds).
- · Try to avoid close contact with people who are unwell.
- · Don't touch your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean.
- Avoid personal contact, such as kissing, sharing cups or food with sick people.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces and objects, such as doorknobs.
- · Stay home if you feel unwell and call Healthline on 0800 358 5453.






Rub hands paim to paim

palm to palm with fingers interlaced




backs of fingers to opposing palms with fingers interlocked




rotational rubbing of left thumb clasped in right palm and vice versa.




rotational rubbing, backwards and forwards with clasped fingers of right hand in left palm and vice versa.



o date the total amount raised worldwide towards our Campaign 100 has reached \$US147.5 million. With a deadline of June 2021 to raise \$US300 million, I would like to encourage all clubs and individuals to help LCIF achieve this goal by donating to this campaign.

In NZ we have a \$2DROP initiative whereby individual Lions put aside \$2 a week and at the end of each month, give this to your club LCIF Coordinator or club Treasurer who will bank it in your name. The accumulated funds at the end of each year can then be deposited into the LCIF bank account in your name.

Thank you to those clubs who have already donated to Campaign 100. With just two months to go in DG Kevin's year, it would be a great achievement for our District to be able to report that 100% of clubs donated to LCIF's campaign.



Update on Australian bushfires. Weather related disasters have increased by over 50% in the last 40 years. This is becoming very apparent not only worldwide but also closer to home in our Constitutional Area with tsunamis, volcanic eruptions, earthquakes, floods, droughts and bush fires. The devastating fires in Australia forced hundreds of families to flee their homes, in some cases lives were lost, and many are now in

desperate need for help to get their lives back on track. Hundreds of people are being prevented from returning to their properties because they don't have water – water tanks just melted in the heat of the fire. The Lions of Australia have risen to help by providing water tanks which will enable people to return to their homes, or in many cases to where their homes once stood so they can rebuild.

Here in 202J, several clubs have donated through LCIF to the bush fire appeal or have supported the plea that came from Australian Lions to assist with funding water tanks which cost \$AU3.000 each. One club in "J" has already donated three tanks, two have donated one each, others have made donations to the Bush Fire Appeal. These donations have been well received and I was delighted to be able to share this with the Australian Lions who attended an LCIF training that I was at in Sydney recently, of our District's contributions. All tanks donated by Lions clubs will have the club name painted on it to acknowledge their donation. A plea to clubs who haven't made a donation to LCIF this year, there is still time to do so; you can tag your donation to the focus area your club wishes and this needs to be written on your deposit.

REMEMBER – every dollar donated to LCIF goes to the cause, nothing is taken for administration etc.

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Preparing for MyLCI Reporting

Club officers 2020/2021 year

nce your club board for 2020/2021 has been elected the names for each position must be reported to Lions Clubs International via My LCI before 15 May.

Prepare now for filing your incoming officers' report by ensuring all members' data is correct in the MyLCI website (where you do your monthly electronic reporting of membership & activities). This is the information that will be included in the report & subsequently in the Multiple District & District directories - incorrect information within MyLCI means errors in the directories.

Check & update data for all members, but the critical ones for the 2020 - 2021 incoming officers' report are:

President

- 1st & 2nd VPs
- Secretary
- Club Administrator (the person who does MyLCI reporting)
- ◆ Treasurer
- Membership Chairman
- LCIF coordinator
- Club Service Chairman
- Club Marketing & Communications Chairman
- Directors.

These are the members you are going to add as Officers of your club for the 2020-2021 Lions year. Ensure details are entered as proper sentence format (i.e. not all capitals)

Follow these steps:

- Go to: https://www.lionsclubs.org/en
- Click: MEMBER LOGIN (in white text on black background at top middle)
- "Welcome to your Lion Account" appears
- Choose Sign In if you already have a user name & password,
- Otherwise choose Register & create your Lion Account. You will be asked "Have you registered on the MyLion app? No/Yes" (for smartphones)
- Once signed in click "GO" under the MyLCI section at the left
- Enter your user name (or membership number if you haven't created a user name) and password and click Submit (Club Home Page appears)
- Click "My Lions Club" (gold text on the dark blue band near top), then "Members". Click on member to have details updated. Click on "Edit Member" at right hand side.
- A new window called "Edit Member" appears. To the right of "First Name" click on the "Change Member Information Request" box.
- ◆ Another window called "Change Member Information Request" opens. Insert the changed details in the fields (boxes) at the right under the heading "Change To".
- If making a name change enter the details in the field (box) "Reason for Name Change".
- If making a birth year change enter the details in the field (box) "Reason for Year of Birth Change".
- Click on "Submit". A confirmation of submitted change window appears.
- If a birth year or name change has been made then it may take LCI a few days to process. The LCI Member Service Centre will send an email once they have processed the change.

- Ensure all data is correct this is the information that will be recorded into the 2020/2021 club officers' report: name, address, phone number/s, email, and spouse/partner. Correct any errors/changes & include the postcode (you can find this at the Address & Postcode Finder: https://www.nzpost.co.nz/tools/address-postcode-finder
- Click "Officer Correspondence Address Same as Member Correspondence Address" to update both addresses
- Click "Save" at the bottom of the page this will update the database at LCI.
- Note: you cannot record on the MyLCI website a club address such as PO Box for subsequent publishing in the Multiple District 202 directory. Only the club members' addresses are recorded on the website. Should your club address be other than a member's address (e.g. a PO Box) please advise the Multiple District office at: md202.secretary@lionsclubs.org.nz

MyLCI Reporting 2020/2021 Club Officers

NOW - To file your incoming officers' report:

- Go back to your club's Home page: Click "Home" at left hand side on dark blue band with gold text below the Lions emblem
- 2. Click "My Lions Club" on the dark blue band to the right of "Home".
- 3. Click "Officers" from the pull down menu, then "Select Term" (at left hand side), then "Next Year" from the pull down menu
- 4. "Officers" page appears: list of vacant offices appears (officer positions are listed at left hand side of page)
- 5. Click on "Add Officer" at right hand side of page for President position
- 6. "Assign Officers" page appears
- 7. Click on "Select Member" (club listing appears)
- 8. Click on member's name for this position. Screen returns to "Assign Officer" page. The member's name is displayed to the left of "Select Member"
- 9. Then click "Save" near the bottom of the screen
- 10. The Confirmation page appears. Beneath "What would you like to do?" choose "Go back to officers"

Repeat the steps 5 - 10 for each of the 1st & 2nd VPs, Secretary, Club Administrator, Treasurer, Membership Chairman, LCIF coordinator, Club Service Chairman, Club Marketing & Communications Chairman & Directors. Then go back to the Home Page.

- 11 Click "My Lions Club"
- 12. Click Reports, Click Lions Clubs Officer Report for Next Year (near bottom of list)
- 13. Click View/Print
- 14. You can now see the report (a pdf file)

Right click to save the report calling it a meaningful name such as club name & year and email to:




