Multiple District News

Dear Lion,

The Illinois State government in the USA announced that its stay-athome order will be extended until at least April 30 to slow the spread of the coronavirus. The measures included the requirement to cease all nonessential services in the state. Lions Clubs International is identified as "nonessential." To comply with the state mandate, the Lions Clubs International Headquarters in Oak Brook will be closed at least until April 30, 2020.

While staff will not physically be in the building, staff teams will be working remotely and available during business hours to respond to the needs of Lions. You may **contact LCI staff** or **LCIF staff** as needed. The performance of systems may be impacted due to the increased number of people working remotely, and response time may be affected. Some of our business operations that require physical interaction will likely be limited.

More details will be provided as the situation evolves, but here is some preliminary guidance:

- For information on district and multiple district conventions, please check our **coronavirus updates webpage**.
- Regarding payment of outstanding dues, we recommend that districts allow clubs that are able to demonstrate they have sent or submitted payment to participate in voting.
- For Lions International payments, please utilize online payment options via MyLCI or any other electronic payment method instead of sending cheques to the office.
- Please <u>submit LCIF donations</u> via the website instead of sending cheques to the office. Please also note that grant disbursements and recognition will be delayed while the office is closed.
- There will be delays in shipping awards and recognitions, club supplies orders, as well as delays in processing reimbursements.

We appreciate your patience during these extraordinary times and wish for the health and safety of all our Lions and staff around the world.

ELECTION OF CLUB OFFICERS FOR 2020/2021 – LIONS DISTRICT 202D

For those Clubs that have **NOT completed** their Club elections, you have 2 options as follows.

1. Roll over positions/hold off elections.

The club can choose to hold off on elections for 2020/2021 and roll over the positions. Positions can be voted in once meetings resume if any officer doesn't want to continue or the club chooses to.

2. Run elections by email

The attached word document details the instructions on how to hold your club elections by email.

In light of the Covid-19 lockdown, approval has been granted for Clubs to undertake both the Club Officer Nomination and Election processes electronically.

The attached instructions have been endorsed by Multiple Districts Legal Advisor and are intended to provide a process for Clubs to complete the Election of Officers for the 2020/2021 Lions year.

The two attachments are

- 'Election of Club Officers for 2020 v2.docx' this is instructions on how to run club elections using email. Note it does not require members to print or scan anything, just reply to the emails and nominate/vote.
- 'Election Tables.xlsx' the tables are to be used in the emails for the nomination/voting are contained in the word document but those with Excel experience might find it easier to use the spreadsheet for adjusting the details and copying the tables.




