A Trust fund has been set up through Blind Foundation South Canterbury.

He is not able to give exact times as weather conditions, road conditions, and alternate routes will make it difficult to give exact details of where he will be.

He will however be in touch daily by phone and I will have some idea of where he will be heading daily.

I hope you find these details not too vague as I am unable to give any more certain times and dates until he is on the road.

Many clubs have offered to support Paul by offering accommodation, meals, and support on the ride through their towns, which is fabulous.

Hi Everyone,

We have all heard about the terrible bush fires in Australia and the devastation it has left behind for families and communities as well as wildlife. Lions Club International Foundation has set up a fund for Lions to donate directly to MD 201 for N.Z to assist with financial support. The following is a request from PIP Barry Palmer, who is also the trustee for Area 7 LCIF.

"Lions of ANZI, You have all read about the Kangaroo fires. They are in urgent need of 60 water tanks for families who are living in tents and caravans. \$3000 AUS will get a family back into their home. Without water they are stuck in in the tent or caravan.

Will your club or zone help???"

With a \$3,000AUS donation to LCIF, your club can have your name on a tank. Please contact your local LCIF Coordinator and they can step you through the process, or contact me on the below address.

\$3,000AUS is for the delivered 22,700lt tank, pumps, pipes, base and installed, filled with fresh water.









Because we are trying to keep the money local, the tanks orders are placed locally. No one local company can handle such an order so we are getting a variety of shapes and colours.

Installation has already started.







As if Water is not a big enough problem – to have nowhere to put it – if you can get some – is a calamity for the families.

Replacement Water Tanks - Here is something we KNOW bushfire victims need and we know specifically where our money goes.

Tanks are going into Central and north coast of NSW – those fires started in November. Elsewhere they are still dealing with flames but replacement tanks will be needed everywhere.

You only have to listen to the News to hear how willing the public is to help. If you have friends, family or business' willing to help, tell them -



Enter our new programme to showcase our "Service Projects"

Every Club in our Constitutional Area 7 covering, Multiple Districts 201 (Australia, Papua New Guinea), 202 (New Zealand, Islands of the South Pacific), 307 (Indonesia), and Region 203 (New Caledonia, Vanuatu, Tahiti) has an opportunity to be recognised by entering their top service project in this new programme. "Service" is our key focus so why don't we tell everyone about what we are doing!

Your Global Service Team is going to help you showcase your projects not only for Lions to see, but the wider community through our network of media channels, local advertising, Facebook and our various publications across our Constitutional Area 7.

As Diabetes is our core focus going forward, we will be keen to see as many new projects undertaken to support this category. A special recognition will be made for the top "Diabetes Project" undertaken by each Multiple District. This may also be judged as the winner of the top project category.

So how will the program run?

- The programme will run from individual Lions Glubs, through District, Multiple District and finally at Constitutional Area level, with the winner being announced at our next ANZI PAGFIC Forum in Perth in September 2020.
- It must be a new and innovative individual Club project started by the Club in this Lions year—not combined dubs or a Zone project.
- Oub Project entries will be judged by a Committee established in each District by the District Governor which
 will include the GST District Coordinator.
- All finalist projects will receive District recognition and will be advertised in District communications and Newsletters.
- One project is chosen from within the District as the "Top District Service Project". This project is submitted to
 the respective Multiple District/Region level Committee for judging. A Diabetes Project may also be chosen
 as the District Top Service project.
- Where a District has chosen a non-diabetes project as their Top service Project, it may also submit their top "Diabetes Project" as a separate nomination.



Top Club Service Project APPLICATION FORM

- The District finalist must be to their Council/Region Chairperson two weeks prior to the Multiple District/Region Convention.
- To judge the District finalist the Council/Region Chairperson will select a Committee, which will include the Council/Region Chairperson, Multiple District GST Coordinator, and two other Lions.
- The Multiple District or Region committee judging the Top Service Project will select one project from all
 projects submitted to become the Multiple District/Region "Top Service Project". If the Top Service Project is
 not a diabetes related project, a special recognition can be awarded to the Top Diabetes Project at each
 MD/Region.
- All finalist Multiple District/Region projects will receive Multiple District recognition with publication on Multiple District Website, Lion Magazine & through Global Action Team communications.
- Each Multiple District/Region winner which will proceed to the Constitutional Area 7 judging prior to the ANZI Pacific Forum to enable preparation of finalist's certificates and winner's trophy.
- Constitutional Area Judging will be undertaken by a Committee including the International Director, CA7 GAT Leader, and the four GAT Area Leaders.
- Promotion of the project at the ANZI Pacific Forum will be the responsibility of each submitting Multiple
 District/Region GST Coordinator, with each area responsible for displaying their winning entry as a Power
 Point Display at the Global Action Team (GAT) Booth at the ANZI Pacific Forum in Perth 2020.
- The finalists, together with their Multiple District GST Coordinator and Council/Region Chairperson will be
 recognized on stage at the ANZI Forum in Perth, with all finalists presented with a Certificate, and the overall
 CA7 winner also presented with the winning plaque/trophy by the International President.
- Project Winning details will then be forwarded by the CA7 GAT Leader to the Service and Marketing Divisions
 of LCI for inclusion in the International Lions Magazine, website recognition etc.




