

PIP Frank Moore The Illinois State government in the USA announced that its stay-at-home order will be extended until at least April 30 to slow the spread of the coronavirus. The measures included the requirement to cease all nonessential services in the state. Lions Clubs International is identified as "nonessential." To comply with the state mandate, the Lions Clubs International Headquarters in Oak Brook will be closed at least until April 30, 2020.

While staff will not physically be in the building, staff teams will be working remotely and available during business hours to respond to the needs of Lions. You may **contact LCI staff** or **LCIF** staff as needed.

The performance of systems may be impacted due to the increased number of people working remotely, and response time may be affected. Some of our business operations that require physical interaction will likely be limited.

More details will be provided as the situation evolves, but here is some preliminary guidance:

- Regarding payment of outstanding dues, we recommend that districts allow clubs that are able to demonstrate they have sent or submitted payment to participate in voting. This could be via a bank statement, copy of demand draft, etc. Clubs will not be cancelled during this time based on the challenges related to receiving and processing physical checks and electronic payments.

Dear Lion,

The Board of Directors has voted to cancel the 2020 Lions International Convention due to concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19). This means that the next International Convention will be held in 2021 in Montreal, Canada.

After evaluating a variety of different options including moving the convention to a different venue or postponing the convention to a later date, the Board of Directors voted to cancel the 2020 convention. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind.

Canceling the International Convention for 2020 impacts international officer continuity and candidate elections. After review of the International Constitution and By-Laws, this impact is outlined below:

Executive officers and international directors will continue in their respective positions until the 2021 convention in Montreal. All candidate elections for these positions shall comply with the provisions of the International Constitution and By-Laws for election at the convention in Montreal.

An international director from the areas of Africa and Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific is permitted only in even-numbered years. As a result, no director from Africa or Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific would be eligible for election until the 2022 convention.

Barring any district election complaints, district governors, first vice district governors and second vice district governors elected during a convention of their respective districts will be accepted by Lions International.

The International Board of Directors intends to authorize commencement of the DG terms beginning July 1, 2020.

We are disappointed that we will not be able to move forward with this international event, but we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions we will continue to find new ways to put our kindness in action while safely serving our communities.



# ALL RIGHT? GETTING THROUGH TOGETHER

#### Looking after yourself and others during COVID-19

As week three of the lockdown unfolds, we are likely to experience a wide range of emotions. But we've made it through the first two weeks, and we can stay the course. We've been blessed with glorious weather, autumn leaves starting to turn, and the Easter bunny still visited many of us. Despite not being able to get out and about other than for essentials, we can communicate easily via text, phone, skype, facetime, messenger and a vast range of methods. Just imagine If this crisis had occurred even 20 years ago, we would not have been able to keep in touch with those we love and care about so easily.

The last month or two have been a bit of a roller coaster. On one hand we hear sad news about deaths that have occurred here and overseas. But on the other, we also hear stories of people looking out for one another, dropping off food or phoning to check in with one another. This is especially important with older family members, friends and neighbours and those with chronic conditions that make them vulnerable to COVID-19. We celebrate our government's speedy and decisive response, the courage of our health workers, supermarket staff, the police and others who make up the frontline. This morning my rubbish bin was collected the same as every Tuesday. A big thank you to all those people working to keep us safe, warm and fed in our bubbles!

We're in this for the long haul, there's talk everywhere that this is a marathon, not a sprint. Life will not go back to normal anytime soon, even if the alert level decreases. 

Earlier this year The Wanaka and Districts Lions Club held a very successful Quiz night for the Australian Fires, at Edgewater Resort.

Club member George Smyth co-ordinated this most successful fundraiser -a job well done.

Our \$6700 raised has gone directly to the Bermagui Lions Club, NSW. Australia.

Australian Fires Quiz Night \$6700 going to Bermagui Lions Club, Australia

Hello Fellow Lions Club. - Wanaka and Districts

Sorry I am a bit slow in responding but been busy here with Fire recovery and Virus.

We are small club at Bermagui in far south NSW Australia, 375km South of Sydney on the coast. Our district covers some of the worst fire damage area. Cobargo and Quaama in particular. These are two small communities which were hit very badly.

Now with the virus and shut downs recovery has become even harder so any help we can get is most welcome. With the aid of the local hardware cp-op we are able to assist those with nothing to repair their lives.

The Picture is 4 shops in Cobargo. Our President has lost everything and being a senior he is presently unwell.

In our District Bermagui and surrounding villages which all suffered various scales of damage to homes and properties which is in the order of 60 or 70 home either destroyed or damaged, Lions Australia is processing the distribution of Grants to as many local applicants as possible for materials needed to help in the restoration of their lives. The amounts of money when totalled are very large. So we wondered what we could do.

A solution which we feel will best serve our local community is through the local hardware co-op. This business was established and is owned and run by the community (I am a share holder with many others) the Co-op has established a fund to which both local and others have been asked to contribute. The intent is to subsidise the purchases of materials for repair and restoration. There are many items which neither insurance or Government cover. We propose that this fund would be the best avenue to ensure that your generous donations will reach the most local people in these villages/localities. ie Cobargo, Quaama which were the worst hit in our District.

We will try to collect some feed back for you to share with your club and supporters as time goes by.

I hope this seems a fair approach to you and we look forward to accepting your generous offer. Our special thanks to our brother in NZ for this very kind and most welcome offer. \$6700. NZ


