What's Lions Reach Out

It's very normal to not feel OK in challenging times such as these. Watching and listening to media and social media

coverage and commentary can be confronting and confusing. However, at a time when we're being asked to physically distance ourselves from one another, we can make use of freed up diary time and our digital devices to stay connected.

It is now even more important that we all promote a sense of community, reach out and ask our friends, family and colleagues, "Are you OK?".

Some people in your world might be feeling anxious, worried about when things will return to normal, be physically unwell or concerned about their health and wellbeing. I encourage you to use this time to pick up the phone, video call, SMS or post online to check in and see how those in your world are doing. If you're feeling well and able to support someone, reach out and let them know you're there to help now and for as long as it takes.

Remember to trust the signs. Be aware of any changes in online behaviour or the way people communicate:

- Consider the tone and language they're using
- Are they posting more or less?
- Are they answering your calls?
- Are they communicating as you would expect?

If you are concerned about someone, trust your gut and ask "Are you OK?".

Listen with an open mind to what they have to say and ask them what you can do to help. In the current circumstances there might be limits on what you can do but you can definitely be a listening ear and a (virtual) shoulder to lean on.

Italian Youth Exchangee Francesco Rizzo

In December 2019, Richard Pedley (2VP Rongotea Lions) & Helena, Richard's wife & family hosted young Italian exchangee



Francesco for a short time when he visited NZ on a Lions Youth Exchange visit. Francesco has been in regular contact with Richard's family, with his impressions about how Italy is coping with the corona virus. **Here is his report.**

Hello everybody.

It's been almost one month and a half since the lockdown started, nobody can go out for any reason but for the shopping of essential goods and groceries. Only one member per each family can leave the house with a signed document with the destination on it (supermarket, chemist...) to show to an eventual police officer.

If you get pulled over by the police and you're missing this document they are likely to give you a 500 euros fine. My parents are the ones dealing with the shopping so they are taking turns going out, (of course wearing rubber gloves and masks). My sister and me are quite busy, personally this is the last year of high school so I'm moving towards the final exam and my teachers have intensified the online lessons that we have from Monday to Saturday for 6 hours !

When I'm not studying, I'm actually doing quite a few activities... I'm trying to learn new cooking skills and experimenting with new recipes and cuisines. On Saturday nights we have created a sort of tradition, making pizzas and playing board games with all the family!

What we can do under Level 2

- Retail outlets and hairdressers will be able to reopen under alert level 2, but there were still be some strict rules.(For retail that means physical distancing for all staff and customers. Larger retailers and malls will follow the lead of our supermarkets. For hairdressers and beauticians it means wearing appropriate PPE.)
- Only hospitality businesses that can apply the 'three S' will be able to open:

Seating: People must be seated to prevent the spread.

Separation: There must be social distancing between people and tables.

Single server: Each table must have just one person serving it.

- Nightclubs and dance venues will be unable to open.
- At level 2 indoor gatherings are limited to a maximum of 100, and outdoor gatherings - which were previously limited to 500 - are now also going to be limited to a maximum of 100.
- Public venues like museums and markets can open again, but with the same public hygiene limitations.
- People will no longer need to stick to bubbles at level 2 and will be able to visit friends and family - but people are advised to keep gatherings small wherever possible.
- New Zealand's borders will remain closed, inter-regional travel will be allowed. (A trip from Wellington to Napier to see your mum is fine, a trip from Wellington to Napier to go to a big conference with an open bar is not fine.)
- Water activity can resume.
- Professional sports such as rugby and netball will be cleared to start up again. There will be no stadium crowds due to the mass gathering restrictions, but "sport will be played".
- In education, early learning, schools and tertiary education can reopen at level 2, but again with hygiene measures. Capability to support distance learning will be maintained.
- Distancing measures in general will remain under a lower alert level. (This means two metres from strangers.)
