Lions promote many engaging youth activities and as youth are the future of Lions, it is vital that we offer them the opportunities and involve them in as many of these activities as we can. We trust all Youth Directors are using their Youth Handbook for referencing Lions Youth Projects/activities.



### The Great Kiwi Youth Exchange.

Planning is well underway for this new youth exchange project in Lions Districts 202D & 202M. The exchange project will provide the opportunity for young people aged 15-18 years to be hosted by Lions' families across the 2 districts for 7 days, in the April school holidays 2021. The Lions 202 Council of Governors have approved the final proposal, and all the final details will be sent out to all clubs before long. We will be looking for host families, as well as possible

young people to take part in the project, so please have a think about these ideas. **The objectives of this project are:** to provide a range of experiences for NZ youth in new environments in urban or rural settings, to develop their life skills their independence and their confidence while participating in a range of different settings, to gain an understanding and appreciation of how people in other NZ communities live, work, play, relax and have fun and to have fun and enjoyment in these new and different activities, challenges and experiences. There are no overseas youth exchanges planned for possibly the next 12 months at least. The International Youth Camp has been cancelled for this year.

- Schools to be contacted Early March
- All Posters MUST be made to required size anything different will not be accepted. THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT!!!!!!
- Club to provide students with A2 size (420mmx594mm) acid & lignin free art paper no less than 100gsm in weight
- All entries must be flexible enough to be rolled up for shipping in 6cm diameter tubes
- Pencils, pens, crayons, markers, paint or chalk may be used. Entries should be sprayed to prevent smearing
- 3D entries will not be accepted. Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way
- Signatures or initials and brief description should be written on the back of the artwork. (see attachment).
- NO LETTERING OR NUMBERS ALLOWED ON THE POSTER
- Posters must not be laminated
- Closing date for District judging is 25/09/20. District judging takes place from 24th October.
   Vouchers will be awarded to the first three places in the District
- Closing date for the Multiple District Judging is 1/12/20. The winning entry for the District goes forward to this competition
- One grand prize winner (Worldwide) receives U\$\$5000, a plaque and a trip for two family members to attend the International Awards ceremony at Lions day with the United Nations (Subject to change). Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of U\$\$500 and a certificate of achievement.
