Part 2 of this webinar series is scheduled for August 29 (a Saturday). Further details will be published soon about start time and how to register.



2020 Presidents Luncheon and Training (yes your read that right it is luncheon not dinner!)

Traditionally as a district we have held a Presidents Dinner in July to celebrate all our club Presidents. This year we are trying something a little different. As well as celebrating our club Presidents, I wanted to add a bit more to the event. So that we have time to 'add a little more' we are holding a luncheon, instead of a dinner. This has the added advantage that you don't have to worry about driving home at night or the cost of staying overnight.

Dave de Graaf from Live For More will be our keynote speaker. At the core of the Live For More organisation is their therapeutic group programme which uses surfing as an effective clinical tool to engage young people who may not respond well to typical intervention. Dave will be talking about what Live For More does and how we as Lions can learn from their approach in our own service journey. After lunch we will also be conducting an additional training workshop for Presidents to supplement the training that was provided by Zoom meetings in June. Bring your questions/challenges and your enthusiasm!

I have served 2 terms as Zone Chair for what is now Zone 7 and last year I had the pleasure of being the GST Coordinator, Paul Reid's understudy for the year.

We in the 202L Cabinet believe that we do NOT celebrate success enough at Club, District and indeed National level. It is after all the Kiwi Way not to put ourselves forward and blow our own trumpets. We must change this and really celebrate our achievements. Getting ourselves out there will achieve our goals of increasing our membership and retaining our current members. What is our motto? It's "We Serve" and we do get out there and serve our communities very well but don't boast about it. Let us be proud of our achievements and let our communities and the world know.



This year we will be continuing with the **202L Top Club Service Award**, started by Paul Reid last year, which will be voted on by Cabinet at each of the 3 remaining Cabinet Meetings.

All clubs are invited to post each quarter a Top Club Project. Projects must preferably be one of our Global Causes, Diabetes, Hunger, Environment, Vision, Childhood Cancer but if you think you have a project that is left field or special please submit it for consideration.

- The District Team will vote at each Cabinet Meeting and one club will be chosen to receive an award for the TOP SERVICE PROJECT.
- The winning Club each quarter will be presented with a trophy by a member of our District Team to acknowledge their contribution to 202L and your Communities. This award could be used as advertising to push the project in the community or indeed simply to raise the club profile to attract new members and leaders for the future.

• The best project for the 2020 - 2021 year will go forward to be voted on by Multiple District at the National Convention and the National winner will go through to our Constitutional area conference and will be voted at ANZI. the winner overall will be notified. Would that be a celebration!

Your winning entry needs to be with us by the 8th November to be in with a chance to take out the very first trophy for this year. Please send to: 202l.gst@lionsclubs.org.nz and I will take to cabinet for voting. Reminders for future cut off dates will be in the Noozletta Calendar.

The next thing is the reporting our Service. I know there has been a great deal of difficulty with the International website. It has improved out of sight and even technologically challenged me was able to get into MyLion and report a project my club carried out over Lockdown. I also found out that any member can log in to MyLion and set up a Project and then all the Secretary or Club Administrator has to do at the completion of the project is tick a few boxes and reporting of that project is complete.

One of District Governor Margaret's Service Goals this year is to have

80% of clubs reporting their Service on MyLion. If you are having difficulty getting in to report your service please contact anyone of the Leadership team being Margaret Gill, Suez Reid, Helen Heywood, Richard Norris, Jan Edgar and myself and we will gladly help you out. Sometimes there is a simple solution to a frustrating problem and having someone else look at it with fresh eyes helps. Our job as the Global Action Team is to be there to help. So don't look on us as the hierarchy we are here to help you achieve your goals as Lions.
