


Hi to all my fellow Lions in 202F.



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# How is this for an incredible Lions **Project?**


In February 2020 I visited family in Northland. Royce Kokich from Mangakahia Lions showed me with pride a recent project that his Club has completed.

Many thanks to all the 202F Lions Clubs who contributed over the past 14 years to the Dialysis Caravan project .

In March prior to the Covid-19 Lock down period the SDHB decommissioned the caravan to be used by dialysis patients. The caravan was then used by the Catlins Medical Centre as an isolation unit/room for the Covid testing of patient, but it is no longer required.

Our directors decided that now is the time to sell the caravan.

The caravan which has new vinyl flooring, been freshly painted inside and out, comes with the water pump and a large storage box at the front, has a TV and DVD player, a comfortable reclining chair and footstool and the caravan is registered and comes with a WOF ready to go. The Owaka Lions Directors have suggested a price of \$7000.

It is set up for an individual to put in their own dialysis machine and filtering system and they can then take their own holiday wherever and whenever they wish.

The Directors wish to give "first option to purchase" the caravan to anyone from the 202F clubs. May be your Lions Club knows or has a connection to someone who would need or want this caravan.

We cannot stop the spring or the autumn or make them other than they are.





#### Queenstown




