In March prior to the Covid-19 Lock down period the SDHB decommissioned the caravan to be used by dialysis patients. The caravan was then used by the Catlins Medical Centre as an isolation unit/room for the Covid testing of patient, but it is no longer required.

Our directors decided that now is the time to sell the caravan.

The caravan which has new vinyl flooring, been freshly painted inside and out, comes with the water pump and a large storage box at the front, has a TV and DVD player, a comfortable reclining chair and footstool and the caravan is registered and comes with a WOF ready to go. The Owaka Lions Directors have suggested a price of \$7000.

It is set up for an individual to put in their own dialysis machine and filtering system and they can then take their own holiday wherever and whenever they wish.

## The Directors wish to give "first option to purchase" the caravan to anyone from the 202F clubs. May be your Lions Club knows or has a connection to someone who would need or want this caravan.

Both John and Carron were dedicated parents during their children's education with John serving on the Ohai School Board of Trustees and Carron on the Takitimu School Board at various times.

#### LIONS CLUB

John had a brief but productive period of membership in the Ohai / Nightcaps Lions Club during the mid 1990's. He was involved with Door to Door Collections and served in the role of  $3^{rd}$  and  $2^{nd}$  Vice President before resigning in April 1998.

#### RUGBY CLUB

John has had a long membership of the Ohai Nightcaps Rugby Club, taking a period at most jobs with the club. This culminated in him and Carron both receiving Life Memberships recently.

John had been the sideline reporter for the live broadcasting reports for the local Radio Station.

John and Carron were usually involved each weekend with clubroom activities including the food and catering for each home game. John and Carron organised the Slink Skin Collection for the club over many years. This was a major fundraising activity for the Rugby Club.

The Rugby club records only go back as far as 2008, however their involvement goes back a lot further than that date. <u>NIGHTCAPS COMMUNITY MEDICAL TRUST</u>

Carron joined the local Medical Trust in Nightcaps in 2003 and served as Treasurer between 2004 and 2013 and Secretary from 2013 until her resignation in early 2018.

#### OHAI VOLUNTEER FIRE BRIGADE

(now known as Fire and Emergency N.Z.)

Carron joined the local Brigade in 2012 and gave 8 years of committed service. She is trained as a Medic and fire fighter and she has won the Ohai Fire Fighter of the Year Trophy, as voted by her fellow brigade members.

She was the Treasurer of the Equipment Account.

John Hogg, Chief Fire Officer commented that Carron is a person that gives her 100% effort every time at the station and at call outs with the highest of care. She was a great help with the recent Covid-19 Lock Down looking after the community.

These two people have probably done many other community activities over the years that only they would know about. They are willing, able and happy to help anyone at the drop of a hat; they do a lot of things behind the scenes without being asked and without asking for anything in return


