ho would have thought the month of August would turn out the way it has after July started out to be such a good month, finishing with an enjoyable afternoon of entertainment from my son Luke at the President's lunch in Oamaru? Then I received a message from Cabinet Treasurer Graeme, telling me he was airlifted to Christchurch Hospital after suffering a major heart attack on the evening following our first Cabinet Meeting. I kept in touch with Graeme while he was being treated. He had a pacemaker fitted and was discharged home on the 8th of August to recuperate, knowing he would have a slow recovery. He suffered complications and sadly passed away on Sunday morning 16th of August. My deepest

Online Banking:

Clubs should be moving now to online banking to speed up their incoming and outgoing payments. If your club hasn't yet changed over, please do so. Any of the banks are very helpful in this regard as they have specialist people to help.

New Member Joining Fee Rebate:

This initiative will continue in this 2020 – 2021 Lions Year, so check your new member registrations and get your application(s) to Cabinet Treasurer.

Multiple District 202 & District 202J ¹/₂ Yearly Dues:

The position regarding Multiple District and District dues is at this stage not clear. However if there are any dues outstanding for which you have been invoiced it would be appreciated if payment made as soon as possible, so that the overall picture can be updated. The invoice will cover both and is payable to the District 202J Administration Account (03-1718-0034650-00). Prompt payment of any outstanding amounts would be much appreciated.

Lions Clubs International ¹/₂ Yearly Dues:

Club treasurers will have received an LCI invoice setting out Half-Yearly LCI Dues in USD and NZD. The exchange rate used is only for the month of the invoice, so if not paid on time an adverse rate movement could leave some arrears. LCI Dues are paid in NZD by the club treasurer direct into the LCI Account (03-0502-0081103-00)

LCI and LCIF deposits:

Please **ALWAYS** email the date, amount and reason for any deposits made to either LCI or LCIF to the District Treasurer, Meredith Lowe once those deposits have been made. The deposits can then be checked that they have been received and reconciled correctly. Up to date banking details will shortly be circulated to all Club treasurers.

Annual Returns:

- Incorporated Societies: (Administration Accounts): These returns (accounts) must have been filed within one month of the balance date of the society concerned unless a formal extension of time has been applied for and received from the Registrar of Incorporated Societies. For this year only the Registrar has granted some extensions informally but that will soon expire if it has not already.
- Charitable Trusts: Returns are due within six months of balance date which for most Clubs was 30 June 2020. Extensions of time for filing by Charities Services are very limited.

Focus on Global Service



component of my role is to report to Cabinet on the Global Service activities of our District's clubs focusing on the five Service Goals set for us all by Lions Clubs International along with other activities of clubs. The LCI Service Goals are:

DIABETES ENVIRONMENT CHILD CANCER HUNGER VISION

As a District we would like clubs to carry out at least one activity in each of these service areas. As clubs plan activities and projects for the 2020/21 Lions year I urge you to give this your consideration. It is acknowledged that there are many demands on clubs for support and that local and regional community needs will be the prime focus for clubs. This is more important now as the longer-term effects from the Covid -19 pandemic spreads throughout the communities that we serve. Clubs are encouraged to identify issues in their communities which Lions could support or take a lead on.

Club Reporting of Activities and Donations

The importance of full reporting of club projects, activities, grants and donations etc. is stressed. Including details of total hours involved in each activity is of upmost importance - this includes hours at Club, Board, Committees, Project organisation and planning along with any training attended. This is the only way that LCI can get a full picture of the work and support that we, as Lions, provide across the world. Many of LIONS global partners consider the efforts of Lions members when deciding on the level of continuing support that they will provide to Lions Clubs International in support of our humanitarian work internationally.

Clubs are encouraged to report all activities using the MyLCI / MY Lion databases. Service activities should go into the MyLion database.

All Lions can have access to MyLCI by simply obtaining a password. The password and access to MyLCI will also provide access to My Lion. The process for getting a password is as follows:

- Log onto the Lions Clubs International website.
- Click on "Member Login".
- Register for MyLCI by creating a unique username and password. Click here to Register.
- You will need your LCI member number for authentication available from your Club Secretary.
- Enter your username and password on the Logon page to access MyLCI and the Directory Log in now.
- You are now ready to access MyLCI.

Once accessed MyLCI is easy to use and allows access to a variety of information and databases.

Cabinet Meeting Executive Summary 26 July 2020

- GLT coordinator Jules said that again he is prepared to travel anywhere to give training. Clubs or Zones only need to ask.
- PDG Les Box spoke about Orientation evenings which had been very successful in the past.
- Instead of calling it a Training Day it be called a Forum and everyone is invited to it. It will be held in Oamaru on the Saturday 26th September 2020.
- It was suggested to Zone Chairmen that they encourage their clubs to attend the District Forum and to bring their flags and any other advertising to the Forum to share their ideas with other clubs
- Safety Plan : Lion Paul Black of the Lions Club of Milton has an excellent blueprint on a Safety Plan. If any club would like a template of it just email Lion Paul.
- Top Service Award: GST Garth said the focus be on Diabetes, and asked all Zone Chairmen and District Bulletin Editors to promote this project. Remembering that this is one of Lions International's Core service projects.
- ELLI meeting: It is to be held on the 6th to the 8th November 2020.
- Convention & Succession: It was discussed that we need to start looking now for Lions to become Zone Chairmen and encourage all Lions to look for prospective Cabinet Officers. J-Times could be used to tell members what a Zone Chairman does and encourage Lions to take on the job.
- Club Excellence Award: Clubs to be made aware of this. DG, VDG, 2nd VDG to mention it to clubs in their travels around the clubs. Also Zone Chairmen please bring it to the attention of your clubs. These must be in by 31st August 2020.
- Bulletin Editor Beryl said that she had been contacted by a Lion in District 202F who said they were very appreciative of getting the J-Times and complimented her on a great District Bulletin and also the Leadership of members of 202J District.
- LCIF: PDG Les asked all Zone Chairmen to get clubs to forward to him their club's LCIF Co-Ordinator. If they don't know who to take on this position it could be the Immediate Past President of the Club. He also spoke about the \$2 drop. If you don't want to do a \$2 drop maybe get a money box. He then produced a box full of money that ZC Judy had given him. He asked ZCs to ask clubs to donate to LCIF. Remembering it is set up by Lions for Lions. Also monies donated can be used for Melvin Jones Fellow.
- Young Speechmaker contest will not be held until next year.

Would You Like to Be a Zone Chairman?

Zone Chairman:

- The zone chairman is the chief administrative officer in the zone and is given direction and supervision by the District Governor. The zone chairman is responsible for serving as chairman of the District Governor's Zone Advisory Committee, taking an active role in organizing new clubs and reports on the activities and wellbeing on all the clubs in their zone. The zone chairman is a member of The District Governor's Cabinet. Usually, the District Governor appoints them, but we as a District wish to have in future years each zone appoint the zone chairman themselves.
- The Zone Chairman is a very important officer in the District Governor's organization. The Zone Chairman should be one who has leadership ability, is well-liked in the area, and above all, is prepared to accept the responsibility of the position and to carry out the duties efficiently, expeditiously and always in the best interests of his/her District.

Some specific responsibilities of the Zone Chairman are as follows:

- To provide an effective liaison between the District Cabinet and the clubs and members of your Zone.
- To attend Designated Zone Chairman Training as advised by GLT Coordinator.
- To attend the regular District Cabinet meetings of the District Governor and the District Convention
- The Zone Chairman is expected to visit each club in his/her Zone by attending at least one regular club tea meeting during the year.
- To arrange and conduct four District Governor's Advisory Committee Meetings during the year (Zone meetings).
- The Zone Chairman should select the dates of their Zone meeting as soon as the District Cabinet meeting dates are published and organize their Zone meetings to be held within two weeks after each District Cabinet meeting to enable information to be passed to clubs as soon as possible.
- Zone Chairman should supply all club secretaries with copies of the "Club Report to Zone Meeting" form which club secretaries are required to complete for presentation at the Zone meetings.
- Copies of all Zone meeting minutes must be sent to all club secretaries

t the time of writing this we are in Lockdown Level 2 which will curtail some of our activities again. Although Lions Clubs International including LCIF are working from home you can still make contact should your club wish to acknowledge one of your members with a Melvin Jones Fellow. If you need further information on this please contact me.

As well as providing funding in times of disasters LCIF also provide grants for specific projects. One such project earlier this year was in Vanuatu – "clearing clouded vision".

"Clerence has battled diabetes since she was a baby. Unable to afford medical care, she developed cataracts which seriously impaired her vision and at 23 years old she could no longer see the beauty of her island. In Clerence's area of Vanuatu, healthcare resources are often unavailable or unaffordable and she suffered through a series of infections, which led to having her toes amputated. Mobility is now difficult, although a wheelchair helps her get around.

Lions of New Caledonia knew they could improve the situation in Vanuatu with support from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). In collaboration with Fred Hollows Foundation New Zealand, Lions of New Caledonia secured a US\$330,043 LCIF SightFirst grant to expand and enhance cataract screening and surgery services in Port Vila, the capital of Vanuatu and Clerence's hometown.

At an existing eye clinic, the grant made it possible to update old equipment and build a new operating theatre and they now have a permanent ophthalmologist. Before this, operations were only performed once a year when a team visited from Fiji. Having a permanent doctor in the area came as an enormous relief to Clerence, who had her cataract removal operation postponed four times due to battling repeated infection.

After the surgery, on checking Clerence's vision she was asked if she could see clearly. Clerence had a smile on her face she couldn't hide. She shouted, "I kiln I pitim kiln!" – meaning "more than clear!" in her native language. What was once dark, cloudy, and blurry, became bright, crisp, and clear"
