





Hospital hedges – a successful working bee was held.





- · 26" elastic cord or 1/8" wide elastic band

FABRIC NOTES -

- we have learned that sturdy woven cotton is the best fabric to use.
- jersey fabrics have too much space between knit stitches which
- makes them less effective in filtering germs.
- if using a fabric with any pattern, orient it horizontally.

 masks should be washed and sterilized, so laundering or drying fabric beforehand will prevent shrinkage after thay are assembled.
