



Hello Lions, 2020 will go down in history as a year to forget. Covid-19 has affected all of us and it is not over yet. I hope you and yours are all safe.




Balclutha St John – mannequin has hit a dead end. New radio telephones are needed so we are going to help them get new RT's. The pricing is to be advised.

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
