

A new home for Tuatapere's emergency services will be one of the beneficiaries of today's annual Tuatapere and Districts Lions Club hay, baleage and silage competition.

Lions Club Hay Drive convenor Quinton Donald said the merger of the rural fire service with the New Zealand Fire Service had created an opportunity to renew the town's emergency services facilities.

"As the current emergency services are outdated plans are afoot and options are being looked at to consider building new facilities in the district," he said.

Entries for the competition were on par with last year and more than \$20,000 worth of sponsorship and prizes had been received from throughout Southland.

Other beneficiaries from the fundraising event would include Hospice Southland and the Lions Club education fund. "In the 25 years, since the Hay Drive has started, we have raised more than \$400,000, with \$103,080 being donated to Hospice Southland - we have donated funds to them every year since 2001," Donald said.



WORLD FESTIVAL OF MAGIC A LIONS CLUB OF INVERCARGILL HOST PROJEC An Article by Lion Kevin Wall



In the 31 years of our World Festival of Magic, we have, via the generosity of our Lions District 202F Business Community, made available over 50,000 free tickets to our disadvantaged children and youth of our Lions District. Here is how this project works \cdot our business community are individually contacted, one by one. \cdot

The businesses manager/owner purchase a number of theatre seats for that years Magic Shows (two shows held each year) – could be one ticket or as many tickets as they wish to sponsor. \cdot They then donate the show tickets back to our Lion's Club and we distribute these tickets to disadvantaged children and their families/support people. \cdot

800 to 1,000 free tickets are available for each show meaning 1,600 to 2,000 free tickets each year. \cdot Each year a troupe of world-class magicians come to Invercargill's Civic Theatre and perform their magic.

For many years, our lead magician has been Chuck Jones who before retiring as a Magician in Las Vegas, was ranked #3 best magician in the world!

After all show costs including troupe, theatre costs etc., are met, the nett funds are donated to charity .

Over \$350,000 dollars has been donated over our 31 years of Magic Shows.

Among the organisations to benefit are:

Hospice Southland, Borland Lodge, Koru Care, Riding for the Disabled groups, Camp Quality, Southland Amateur Radio, Southland Hospital, Special Olympics Southland, CCS Southland, Conductive Education Southland, Ronald McDonald House, Cancer Society, Alzheimer's Society, Heart Foundation, Chemo Crazies, Womens' Refuge's, Number 10 Youth Centre (Southland Youth Onst Stop Shop), Multiple Sclerosis Society, Age Concern groups, numerous items of equipment for Southland Hospital, plus many others have benefitted from our World Festival of Magic annual shows.



I am putting this our there for everyone to access and hopefully help all to keep safe.




