## **Used Hearing Aids & Batteries Collection**

 These can be dropped off at any Triton Hearing Clinic & the money raised goes towards funding cochlear ear implants (government funding has been reduced recently).

## **Mobile Phone Recycling**

Starship Hospital withdrew from the recycling scheme in 2015. Other charities now benefit through various agencies:

- Drop your unwanted old phones o ff at 2 degrees, Spark & Vodafone shops for the RE:MOBILE scheme which is accredited by the Ministry for the Environment. Sustainable Coastlines benefits.
- Autism NZ is teamed up with Swapkit NZ where old mobile phones are swapped for new technology. Participating schools, groups or individuals gather donated phones & once enough have been collected Swapkit will arrange a pick up & gift an iPad, laptop or tablet depending on how many phones are collected. Individual Swapkit envelopes can send a maximum of two phones.

### 2020 Lions Cancer Shuttle Project -Canterbury West Coast Cancer Society – Annual Fundraising Project

#### Hi fellow Lions,

I trust that you are all well and working through the challenges that Covid 19 has raised this year.

It's time once more to invite clubs to join us in contributing to the cost of running the Canterbury/ West Coast Cancer Society Shuttle. Sadly, John Cramond, our Lions member who initiated this project, passed away a few months ago, and I have taken on the role of coordinating raising funds for this very worthwhile cause.

Last year the cost to deliver the shuttle service was \$65,800.00 and this year we know the costs will be higher as a result of COVID-19. The shuttle is having to make more trips to maintain social distancing, new cleaning protocols and a potential extension to the hours they provide the service, all will contribute to increased costs. With the support of the Lions clubs they are able to deliver a safe environment for both their staff and those using the service. In 2020 a large number of their normal fundraising events have been unable to be held resulting in a significant impact to their income. This coupled with increased costs across the board as a result of COVID-19 has and continues to be challenging.

The last financial year saw the shuttle make 16366 trips for 1534 patients and below shows the region / area for each of those patients:

Last year, 21 Lions clubs from 202E and 202J generously donated \$11,450, with amounts ranging from \$200, up to \$1,000. This was forwarded to the Cancer Society just before Christmas, and was gratefully received. Our collective contribution virtually covered the annual fuel cost, reducing the load considerably. Although the Cancer Society Canterbury/West Coast pays for the running of the service, it is almost entirely used by people requiring help who live in our 202E and 202J districts. I am sure that there are very few Lions in these districts who have not known friends or relatives who had need to use this valuable service.

I am delighted to say that Hokitika has already sent their donation through this year – thanks very much, Hokitika Lions!

Once again, can clubs please direct credit their contributions through to Motueka Lions Trust Account, Nelson Building Society Motueka, A/c No is 03 1354 0222094 00, using shuttle and your club name as a reference.

#### For clubs using a chequebook, cheques can be forwarded to The Treasurer, Motueka Lions Club, PO Box 129, Motueka 7143.

All funds will be collated and forwarded to the Canterbury West Coast Cancer Society in one final payment, with a list of the contributing Lions clubs and contact details. The Cancer Society will then issue individual receipts to the clubs. We will work to a cut-off date of 20 November 2020.

We look forward to working with fellow clubs, to CHALLENGE and exceed last year's total.

#### Part 1: The Beginnings of the LMCT

loyd Morgan, an outstanding New Zealand Lion, served as International President during the 1979 / 80 Lions Year. It is customary for LCI to make a presentation to their retiring President, in recognition of their service. In most cases, the presentations take the form of a substantial personal gift, such as a luxury motor car. Lloyd Morgan made it known to the New Zealand Lions clearly and firmly that he would not accept a personal gift. Nevertheless, there were Lions within our Multiple District who were determined that Lloyd's year would receive permanent and lasting recognition. PDG David Gault recalls ..... "In 1978, it was very much in our minds that we had to make provisions for Lloyd's departure from office as International President. Council Chairman PDG Bob Collins had said it was a matter for the International Officers Support Committee of which PID Alex Grieve was Chairman. Alex, PDG John Armstrong and I were driving from Timaru to a Multiple District Convention in Dunedin and I asked the other two what they thought about a charitable trust in Lloyd's name. This suggestion met with general approval at the next IOSC meeting. PDG John Armstrong (North Is) and PDG Ray Carter (South Is) were appointed fund raising convenors. The Lions clubs of New Zealand generously donated \$38,000 which was the foundation on which the Trust was built. It's history that in 1980 PID Pat Ryan (then Council Chairman) presented the Trust to Lloyd at Chicago, in his final plenary session as International President".

Lions in MD202 owe a lot to these four great Lions in forming the Lloyd Morgan Lions Clubs Charitable Trust. In those days, that amount of money would have bought about three luxury motor cars, and this and the concept of the Trust caused guite a stir in some quarters. The Lloyd Morgan Lions Clubs Charitable Trust (LMLCCT) is unique in the world of Lionism, and has gone from strength to strength. The Trust holds a prominent place of respect and value in Multiple District 202. Lloyd was firstly Chairman then Patron of the Trust for his lifetime. and took a keen interest in Trust affairs, particularly in his capacity as a member of the Grants and Loans Committee. Lloyd was an inspiration to all who knew him, and thoroughly deserved the high level of respect and admiration accorded to him by members of the Lions family around the world and at all levels of our International Association. Sadly, Past International President Lloyd Morgan, OBE passed away on the 24th August 2001. Although the Trust bears his name, Lloyd always insisted that the Trust belongs to New Zealand Lions, and took great pleasure observing first-hand what Lions have been able to accomplish with the help of the Trust, and the special place it occupies within the Lions family.

#### And Today

From the small beginnings of \$36,000 your trust looks after a capital fund of \$6,000,000. Plus funds held in Special trusts of \$1.6 million and distributes to clubs annually between \$150,000 and \$200,000 to assist with projects.
